Garrison Diversion Board of Directors Elects Three Members to Serve on Executive Committee

CARRINGTON, ND (February 11, 2016) – At their recent quarterly board meeting, Garrison Diversion board members held elections for the Executive Committee. Kelly Klosterman, Richland County, was re-elected to serve an additional term on the committee, while directors Dave Anderson, Pierce County, and Bill Krivarchka, Traill County, were elected for a two-year term on the committee.



Kelly Klosterman will serve an additional term on the Executive Committee. He has been a representative of Richland County since 2007. In addition to serving on the Executive Committee, Kelly will also chair the Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee. Kelly is a farmer near Mooreton.



Dave Anderson was newly elected to serve a two-year term on the Executive Committee. Dave has been a board member representing Pierce County since 2011. In addition to his role on the Executive Committee, Dave will chair the Engineering and Operations Committee. He recently retired from his position as an Ag Banker at Bremer Bank in Rugby and continues working as a cattle and grain farmer.



Dr. Bill Krivarchka was also newly elected to serve a two-year term on the Executive Committee. Bill is a long-time member of the board, serving as the Traill County representative since 2003. He will also chair the Recreation Committee. Bill is a retired dentist and an active community service member in Mayville.

The Executive Committee monitors the financials, federal matters and overall operations of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. The committee consists of ten members, each serving a two-year term, and is headed by the chairman of the board, Ken Vein, from Grand Forks County.

The Garrison Diversion Board of Directors has 28 members, each of whom represents a member county. The board works to fulfill Garrison Diversion's mission to provide a reliable, high quality and affordable water supply to benefit the people of North Dakota.
