September 20, 2023

A meeting of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District's Recreation Committee was held at the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District in Carrington, North Dakota, on September 20, 2023. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Klein at 9:30 a.m.

OTHERS PRESENT

Garrison Diversion staff and others were present. The registration sheet is attached to these minutes as Annex I.

The meeting was recorded to assist with compilation of the minutes.

READING OF THE MINUTES

Motion by Director Johnson to dispense with a reading of the March 30, 2023, Recreation Committee minutes and approve them as distributed. Second by Director Cayko. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

CURRENT FUNDING AND PROJECT REVIEW

Merri Mooridian, Secretary, reviewed the list of current projects. The amount expended toward projects in 2023 is \$470,385. The balance remaining to be expended on outstanding projects is \$1,684,469. A copy of the table showing current projects is attached to these minutes as Annex II.

EXPIRING PROJECTS

Casselton Parks and Recreation - - Ms. Mooridian reported Casselton Parks and Recreation was awarded \$1,995 in 2023 to purchase flex fiber mulch for placement at the Casselton playgrounds. A balance of \$1,390 has yet to be expended on this project. The organization was contacted, and they are waiting for delivery of the mulch the end of September; therefore, they have requested an extension on the project until October 31.

Stacey Gussiaas, Administrative Assistant, Garrison Diversion, informed the committee the invoice has been received.

Ms. Mooridian suggested since the project deadline was September 1, allowing an extension until September 30 to complete the bookkeeping portion of the project would be acceptable.

Motion by Director Cayko to extend the project deadline for Casselton Parks and Recreation until September 30, 2023. Second by Director Metzger. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

Ms. Mooridian referred to the completed projects table. Funding in the amount of \$7.3 million has been awarded for recreation projects since the program's inception. Expenditures for the program are \$6.7 million. A copy of the table is attached to these minutes as Annex III.

RECREATION GRANT FORM

Ms. Mooridian referred to the grant application form, which is included in the meeting packet for the committee's referral.

REVIEW OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Valley City Parks and Recreation District - - Ashley Martinson and Macy Schlaht, Valley City Parks and Recreation District, presented the park district's funding request in the amount \$75,000 for construction of six new pickleball courts at Hi-Line Park. The total estimated project cost is \$500,135. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IV.

City of Casselton - - Dylan Dunn, representing the City of Casselton, addressed the committee regarding Casselton's funding request for \$75,000 to construct a shared use path along Highway 18 with a crossing over Swan Creek. The path will connect residential areas to multiple recreation destinations around the city. The total estimated project cost is \$2,050,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex V.

Fargo Park District - - Tony Schmitt, Director, Fargo Park District, presented a request for funding in the amount of \$62,500 for the purchase and installation of new playground equipment at the Pepsi Soccer Complex. The total estimated project cost is \$250,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VI.

City of Oakes - - Rebecca Udem and Kasha Magill, representing the City of Oakes, presented the city's \$29,875 funding request to develop Oakes Main Street Park. This will create a gathering

and outdoor event space for the community. The project includes site development, a covered pavilion, murals, water features, planting beds, flagpoles, outdoor stage, lighting and fencing. The total estimated project cost is \$119,500. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VII.

Ms. Mooridian asked if any of the items have been completed on the park project to date.

Ms. Udem said yes, the pavers are all done.

Ms. Mooridian stated the grant program will not award funding for any work items already completed.

Upon discussion, the Committee agreed the following components are not eligible costs under the matched recreation grant guidelines; therefore, no funding will be allowed for the building wall preparation nor the wall murals. Since the pavers have already been completed, no funding will be awarded for that component as well. This decreases the total estimated project cost to \$104,500, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount of \$26,125.

Carrington Park District - - Denise Shipman, representing the Carrington Park District presented the park district's request for \$26,907 in grant funds for the baseball diamond field/fencing project at the city park. The project includes installing drain tile and fencing, as well as backstop netting, walls, padding and concrete. The total estimated project cost is \$107,625. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VIII.

Grand Forks Park District - - Leif Larson, Grand Forks Park District, presented the park district's funding request in the amount of \$56,250 for phase two of the substantial refurbishing of the baseball field complex. The project consists of replacing and installing new synthetic infield turf at Kraft Field. The total estimated project cost is \$225,410. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IX.

LaMoure City Park District - - Hope Coleman and Kelli Isaacson, LaMoure City Park District, presented the request for \$75,000 in grant funding to construct the Sunset Park Swim Center, consisting of a new swimming pool and splash pad in LaMoure. The total estimated project cost is \$1,824,456. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex X.

Devils Lake Park Board - - Terry Wallace, Interim Superintendent, Devils Lake Park District, presented the funding request for \$37,500 to purchase and install playground equipment in the Devils Lake Family Entertainment Center. In addition to the playground, the center will include a walking track, bowling alley, pickleball courts, multi-sport simulators, an arcade and two community rooms for parties and gatherings. This will all be housed in a former grocery store building located on the corner of two highways in Devils Lake. The parks and recreation office will also be moved to this location. The total estimated project cost for the indoor playground is \$150,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XI.

Ramsey County Fair Board - - Margaret Kraling, Alvina Ebensteiner, Ramsey County Fair Board, presented their \$100,000 funding request to assist with the construction of the Ramsey County Multi-Purpose Event Center to be located at the fairgrounds. This is an all seasons building and will be used to host 4-H activities, shooting sports activities, livestock shows, agriculture educational programs, ATV training and other youth-related programs. The total estimated project cost is \$2,800,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XII.

Minot Park District - - Elly DesLauriers, Executive Director, Minot Park District, presented a request for grant funding in the amount of \$75,000 to construct a pump track west of the Jack Hoeven Baseball Complex. A pump track is for wheeled sports equipment that, when ridden properly, does not require pedaling or pushing, but a pumping action to maintain momentum. It consists of a series of bumps or small hills and corners. The total estimated project cost is \$300,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIII.

City of Landa - - The City of Landa requests \$6,250 in grant funds to construct a restroom facility at the Landa City Park. The total estimated project cost is \$25,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIV.

Ellendale Park Board - - The Ellendale Park Board requests \$5,749 to expand its current ice skating rink into a more comprehensive and accessible winter park space. This includes improvements to the warming house, the purchase of benches and an ice rink liner and construction of a sledding hill. The total estimated project cost is \$22,995. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XV.

Upon discussion, the Committee agreed the following components are not eligible costs under the matching recreation grant guidelines; therefore, no funding will be allowed for: 1) the purchase of skates or hockey equipment, 2) Snow Cat use, or 3) repairing the fire hydrant. With the deduction of these items, the revised estimated project cost is \$18,895, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount \$4,500.

City of Towner - - The City of Towner is requesting \$2,250 in funding assistance from the grant program for improvements to the city's baseball field consisting of dirt work, drainage and tree planting. The total estimated project cost is \$15,000, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount of \$3,750. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVI.

McLean County Commission - - The McLean County Commission is requesting \$1,743 in grant funds for the construction of a public stairway at Dynamite Bay. This includes stairs, two landings and handrails. The total estimated project cost is \$6,472, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount of \$1,618. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVII.

City of Forman - - The City of Forman is requesting grant funds in the amount of \$1,300 to move the community garden to an area near Central Park and increase the number of garden beds. This includes purchasing and installing two benches, six garden beds, planter fabric, woodchips, footing materials and a new park grill. The total estimated project cost is \$5,500, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount of \$1,375. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVIII.

Sheridan County Park Board - - The Sheridan County Park Board is requesting funds in the amount of \$2,850 to purchase six new picnic tables and courtesy dock for Hoffer Lake Recreation Area. The total estimated project cost is \$11,398. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIX.

Mayville Park Board - - The Mayville Park Board's funding request is for \$14,000 for the surfacing of two concrete slabs (basketball courts) in addition to three new basketball hoops; two at Waterpark and one at Southside Park. The total estimated project cost is \$56,004. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XX.

Upon discussion, the Committee agreed maintenance or repair of existing projects, which includes repairing the existing basketball courts, are not eligible costs under the matching recreation grant guidelines; however, funding is eligible for the purchase and installation of the basketball goals, acrylic backboards and flex goals. With the deduction of the resurfacing costs, the revised estimated project cost is reduced to \$8,000, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount \$2,000.

Mayville Park Board - - The Mayville Park Board is also requesting funding in the amount of \$21,887 for landscaping, signage, parking and interior fencing at Cometville Park. The total estimated project cost is \$87,548. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXI.

Mayville Park Board - - The Mayville Park Board requests \$6,689 in grant funding for the purchase and installation of two FUNbrella shade structures at Waterpark. The total estimated project cost is \$26,754. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXII.

Upon discussion, the Committee asked that the park board be contacted to justify the high cost for installation of the FUNbrellas.

Mayville Park Board - - The Mayville Park Board's last funding request is for \$3,033 to purchase and install three water circulation fountains and two light features for the pond at Island Park. The total estimated project cost is \$12,133. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIII.

Upon discussion, the Committee agreed algae control/fountain lights are not eligible project costs under the recreation program guidelines.

Ward County Parks - - Ward County Parks is requesting grant funds in the amount of \$8,071 for the purchase and installation of 15 grills at Old Settler's Park and 8 picnic tables and 5 security cameras at Rice Lake Campground. The total estimated project cost is \$32,287. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIV.

Fessenden Park Board - - The Fessenden Park Board is requesting funds in the amount of \$75,000 for the construction of a splash pad in Fessenden. The total estimated project cost is \$197,000, which allows for 25% funding of the non-federal share in the amount of \$49,250. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXV.

COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION OF GRANT APPLICANTS

Approved Projects

Chairman Klein stated the total amount of approved grants is \$692,521. Currently, there is \$374,534 in the Recreation Fund. The remaining \$317,987 would need to come from the Recreation Reserve Fund.

Motion by Director Cayko and Second by Director Walter to approve a grand total of \$692,521 to be allocated to the following recreation grant program applicants:

Valley City Parks and Recreation District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 for construction of six new pickleball courts at Hi-Line Park.

City of Landa up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$6,250 to construct a restroom facility at the Landa City Park.

City of Casselton up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 for the development of Governor's Drive shared use path throughout the City of Casselton.

Fargo Park District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$62,500 for the purchase and installation of new playground equipment at the Pepsi Soccer Complex.

Ellendale Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$4,500 for the expansion of the ice skating rink in Ellendale. The following components are not eligible costs under the recreation grant guidelines: 1) the purchase of skates or hockey equipment, 2) Snow Cat use, or 3) fire hydrant repair.

City of Oakes up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$26,125 for the development of Oakes Main Street Park. The following components are not eligible costs under the recreation grant guidelines: 1) wall preparation and murals and 2) pavers.

Carrington Park District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$26,906 for the baseball field/fencing project at the city park. The project includes installing drain tile and fencing, as well as backstop netting, walls, padding and concrete.

Grand Forks Park District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$56,250 for phase two of the substantial refurbishing of the baseball field complex. The project consists of replacing and installing new synthetic infield turf at Kraft Field.

LaMoure Park District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 to construct the Sunset Park Swim Center, consisting of a new swimming pool and splash pad in LaMoure.

City of Towner up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$3,750 for improvements to the city's baseball field consisting of dirt work, drainage and tree planting.

McLean County Commission up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$1,618 for the construction of a public stairway at Dynamite Bay, including stairs, two landings and handrails.

Devils Lake Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$37,500 to purchase and install playground equipment in the Devils Lake Family Entertainment Center.

Ramsey County Fair Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 for construction of the Ramsey County Multi-Purpose Event Center to be located at the fairgrounds.

City of Forman up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$1,375 to move the community gardens to an area near Central Park and increase the number of garden beds. This includes purchasing and installing two benches, six garden beds, planter fabric, woodchips, footing materials and a new park grill.

Sheridan County Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,850 to purchase six new picnic tables and a courtesy dock for the Hoffer Lake Recreation Area.

Mayville Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,000 for the purchase and installation of the basketball goals, acrylic backboards and flex goals at Waterpark and Southside Park.

Mayville Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$21,887 for landscaping, signage, parking and interior fencing at Cometville Park.

Mayville Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$6,689 for the purchase and installation of two FUNbrella shade structures at Waterpark, contingent upon receiving justification as to the high cost for the installation.

Ward County Parks up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$8,071 for the purchase and installation of 15 grills at Old Settler's Park and 8 picnic tables and 5 security cameras at Rice Lake Campground.

Minot Park District up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$75,000 to construct a pump track west of the Jack Hoeven Baseball Complex.

Fessenden Park Board up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$49,250 for the construction of a splash pad at the city pool.

Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Forde, Johnson, Klein, Metzger, and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Denied Projects

Mayville Park District - - The Committee elected not to provide funding to Mayville Park Board for the purchase and installation of three water circulation fountains and two light features for the pond at Island Park because these items do not meet eligibility of the grant program guidelines.

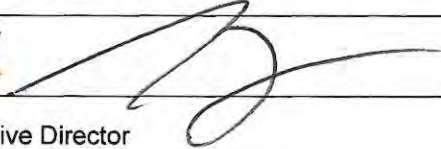

Project Summary

This project consists of building six new pickleball courts at Hi-Line Park in the southwest corner. The West North Central Region, which includes North Dakota, shows the fastest growth in pickleball players at 29.8% year-over-year in 2022 (pickleballheads.com). Just in our community, we have seen a tremendous increase in participation with our indoor pickleball. We are currently offering pickleball four days a week for both open and league play but could use more space. All are welcome to play pickleball hosted by the park district. A variety of levels are offered, ranging from open play geared more towards beginners to competitive tournaments. When we first started offering pickleball in 2018, it was a small group made up of mostly senior couples just wanting to play for fun. Since then, we have expanded to leagues with participants of all ages and have been able to put on a few tournaments. From a recreation standpoint, it has been enjoyable to see players improve their skills along with the expansion of the sport.

When we first offered pickleball, we started small because we were unsure of how many people would participate. We bought two portable nets, 10 sets of paddles and a handful of indoor balls. That original group was made up of about five couples that would play when they could. Those couple slowly started to encourage friends and family to come try playing. Things snowballed from there and the league grew to over 50 people in a matter of a few weeks. We also have people traveling from smaller towns outside of Valley City, Jamestown and Fargo coming to take part in our leagues. Some nights during open play, we have people sitting in the bleachers waiting to play because we just don't have the room for more courts. Due to the increase in participation, we had to get more equipment to accommodate the higher numbers. We now have 10 portable nets, over 25 sets of paddles and indoor and outdoor balls in an array of colors. We have even had some of our more dedicated pickleball players donate packs of balls to make sure we never run out. All this equipment is used between the Rec Center and Wellness Center. These amenities are great for all kinds of indoor pickleball play but doesn't solve the problems of lack of outdoor courts or allowing people to play year-round.

We feel the addition of permanent courts will allow us to offer pickleball year-round and grow interest in the sport. Due to the growing participation in pickleball and the exercise benefits for all who play, we want to be able to offer pickleball year-round without the conflict that comes when playing with blended lines on a tennis court. Right now, all organized pickleball is located inside our Rec Center (there is open pickleball at the Wellness Center but that is not nearly as competitive as league play at the Rec Center). This works during the school year but as soon as summer hits, the Rec Center gets extremely busy with youth basketball camps, youth volleyball camps and tournaments and a variety of other activities put on by different clubs along with park district events. We feel like having courts already set up at a permanent facility will allow for people to try playing on their own, which could lead to them playing in leagues. We have snowbirds in our community come back for summer raving about the outdoor facilities they have played at in warmer states. Besides talking about how nice those facilities are, they also ask when we are getting a facility like that. Not only would permanent courts improve pickleball in

Valley City, but it would also be the only outdoor facility between Bismarck and Fargo (almost a 200-mile radius).

Exercise is one of the most underutilized ways to improve someone's mental health. Another way is to get outside. This past winter alone we had snow from November to mid-April. In that time, we had a handful of blizzards shutting down businesses and the schools. Harsh winters make getting outside even more important in the summer. Having options to play pickleball through league play or playing on your own combines being outside and getting some exercise. Sports, in general, are also a great way for people to socialize and find a sense of belonging in a community.

Governor's Drive Shared Use Path, Casselton

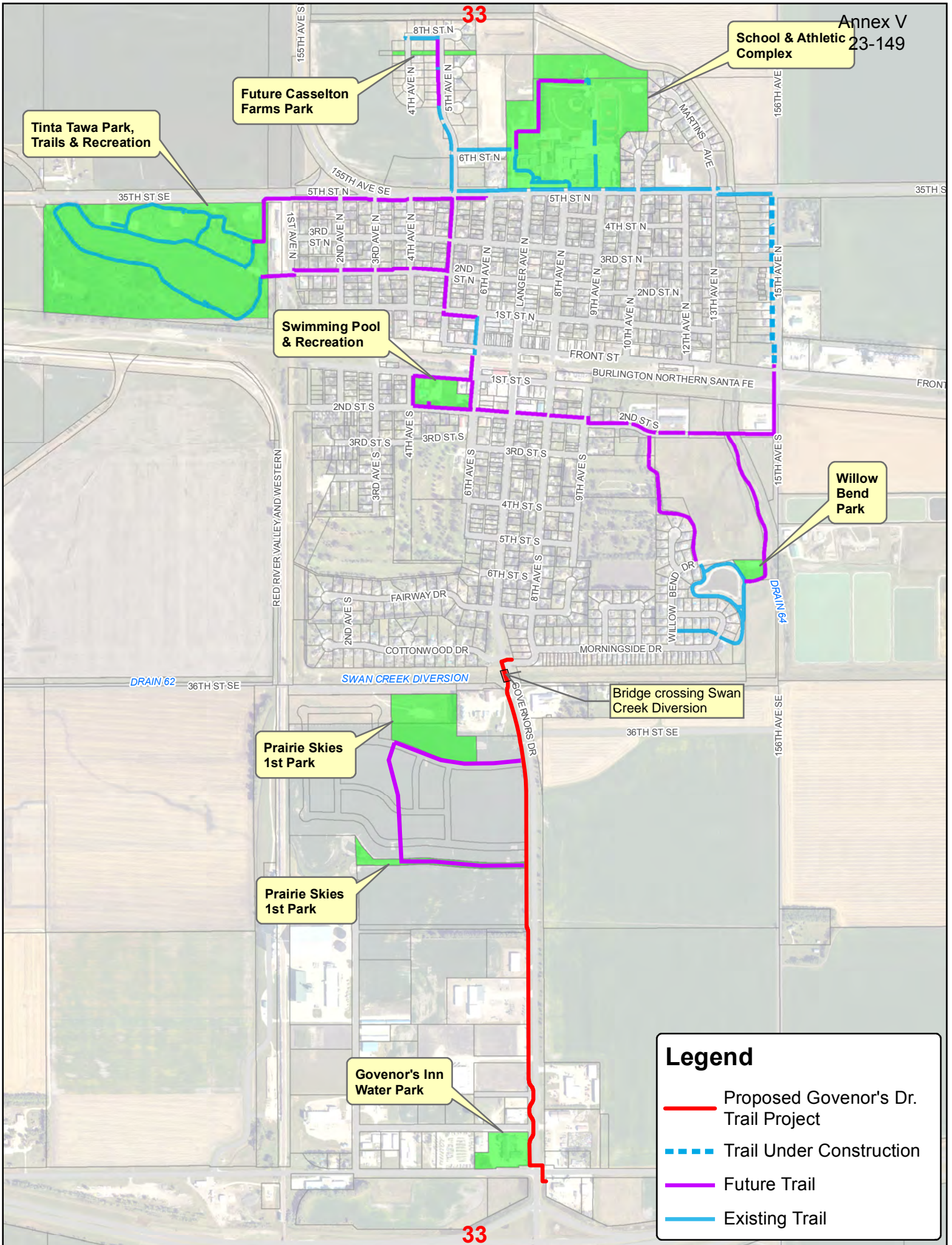
Description of Project Features:

The project consists of a 10' wide concrete shared use path along ND Highway 18 with a crossing over Swan Creek. The path will connect residential neighborhoods to multiple recreation destinations, including the city pool, an indoor waterpark, a fitness center, along with other commercial destinations. The crossing of Swan Creek, which would otherwise be a barrier, provides recreational opportunities for enjoying the creek corridor and admiring the prairie landscape. The path will also enable safe non-motorized travel to and from a growing commercial area on the south side of the city. The path will also be immediately adjacent to the Prairie Skies Development, a planned residential subdivision that includes a large park. This new park will draw locals from existing neighborhoods on the north side of the Swan Creek Diversion and will ultimately increase usage of the path. The project is consistent with the path network masterplan, included in this application.

To allow users to safely cross the Swan Creek Diversion, this project will construct a prefabricated steel pedestrian bridge adjacent to the state highway bridge. This application is requesting funding assistance for the bridge portion of the project.

Describe the Project Site As Is and Proposed Changes:

The area where the pedestrian bridge is proposed is a channel for the Swan Creek Diversion. The pedestrian bridge location would utilize the existing embankment of the State Highway bridge creating a logical crossing location, shortening the crossing and decreasing the overall bridge cost. Sidewalk from the north ends on the north side of Swan Creek with no connection to the new park in Prairie Skies Development. The Bridge and path would extend a connection to the newest part of the City to the south.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The Pepsi Soccer Complex was established at the Hector International Airport property by the Fargo Park District in 2001. The complex is one of the premier soccer complexes in the Fargo-Moorhead-West Fargo area. The complex has 10 irrigated fields and 2 lit fields along with a concession stand, a playground, restrooms, and parking lots. The Fargo Park District has identified the current playground structure as a needed replacement within the park district due to the age, use, and the need to improve accessibility. The existing playground was manufactured by Landscape Structures and installed at the complex in the Spring of 2004. The new playground installation will improve play value, accessibility, and update the play equipment with a soccer theme to fit with the primary use of the complex, soccer. The current plastic border will be replaced with a permanent concrete border, and three bench pads and benches will be installed to provide seating for users of the playground.

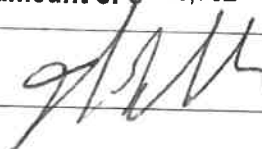

Detailed Project Description:

The lot is about 75 feet wide and approximately 120 feet deep. There is currently grass planted and a few trees but until now, no group has taken the time or made the effort to develop it further. There is very little public seating along our Main Street and absolutely no outdoor seating, despite having a coffee and ice cream shop next door to this space.

We want to create a community gathering and outdoor event space that could be used for outdoor performances, outdoor eating, and community gatherings. Included is a covered pavilion that will provide an outdoor space that doesn't currently exist in Oakes.

Our plan was designed to create a multi-purpose, flexible, and collaborative design so we could maximize the investment by serving the most people and needs.

Our community has a large number of public parks and most of them are built and designed to support the outdoor play of children. There isn't a single park in our community designed specifically for the enrichment of our community or one that is fully ADA-compliant.

We believe that vibrant, aesthetically appealing spaces create the kind of community that people want to live in, ensuring this project makes an important economic development impact. Quality of life includes feeling a sense of belonging, and with this space, organic connection among community members will happen through day-to-day interactions, along with facilitated gatherings through more formally planned activities and events.

We believe in the power of the arts and the impact that they have on our mental health and overall social and emotional well-being. On each side of our park, we are working with the respective building owners to include the exteriors of their buildings in our design.

We plan to contract with a muralist to create a full building mural on each exterior wall that flanks the park. This will warm up the space and help us create the kind of inspiring environment that allows us to think more creatively.

We will also include locally designed sculptures for the park. These have not been contracted yet, but the goal is to create something of historical significance to our community or the state of North Dakota.

We believe in the value of multi-generational interactions. Our ADA-compliant design in the space provides another way for people of all ages and abilities to engage with one another and their natural environment.

We want to install two water features, lending a pleasant and appealing sound to the overall tranquility and peace of the space.

The beautifully designed planting beds create a connection to nature that currently can't be found along Main Street.

We see the importance of giving more prominence to the flagpoles in the area. They aren't given any reverence in their current location and moving them in a mindful way in our design would allow them to be featured.

The outdoor stage is a key component of our design.

We want this space to be the kind of place where people *want* to be and having a stage where we can bring in entertainers, speakers, and other acts creates a reason to come to Main Street.

Much of our concept is modeled after Block 9 in downtown Fargo which offers many of the same amenities and features. With Fargo being the biggest city in the state of North Dakota, people expect to find a park like this there and The Kilbourne Group is a developer happy to pay for the creation of the space; people do not expect a small community to deliver a similar concept nor do we have a developer locally that would take it on.

We have considered how to "right-size" this project to our community, but the basics of solid placemaking hold in a town regardless of size; we are just far less likely to get our local government to step forward and offer to help.

We almost have to build this project privately or through grants such as this one being offered through Garrison Diversion Conservancy District. With the incredible partnerships we've already developed within Oakes, we believe that with the right support, we can make this happen, even if we're approaching it in an unconventional manner.

Project Status and Timeline:

This project is already underway as we've already purchased the lot, met with various stakeholder groups to determine the need and desire for the project's success and to determine which organization would take ownership of the project management and ongoing maintenance of the park once completed.

We'd like to complete this project as soon as possible having already installed the entire paver walkways and patio.

OUR REQUEST

The Grand Forks Park District plans to replace the Infield Turf at the Kraft baseball field in Grand Forks. The Kraft Field Turf project is the second phase of a substantial refurbishing of the baseball field complex in entirety, which has been in the planning for several years and started underway this spring.

Through the summer of 2023, the Kraft Field grandstand structure has been going through a replacement process. The grandstand replacement was the first phase of the overall Kraft Field restructuring project and in 2022, the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District awarded the Grand Forks Park District a grant for the Kraft Field Grandstand replacement. We anticipate the grandstand to be completed by spring of 2024 and the Infield Turf phase to commence thereafter. We respectfully request a grant for the Infield resurfacing of this state-of-the-art baseball infield at the Kraft Field complex.

A conceptual drawing and a pricing proposal for the Infield Turf has been attached to this grant application.



NEED FOR THE INFIELD TURF AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

The existing artificial infield surface at Kraft Field was installed in 2011 and became one of the first artificial baseball playing surfaces in the state. However, over time with wear and tear, the lifecycle of this surface has come to its end and replacement is badly needed. With the long North Dakota winters, an early start to the baseball season can make a significant difference to the players and organizations who use Kraft Field for play, practice and competition. The artificial turf allows spring drying to occur more quickly as well as games to be played on a wider range of weather conditions.

The project has been a priority for the Grand Forks Park District as it analyzes its facilities throughout the city to match community needs within current budgetary constraints. The Grand Forks Park District has been in cooperation with the Grand Forks Area Youth Baseball Association since the fall of 2019 in developing a proactive concept to the overall plans for Kraft Field.

Currently the user base includes, among others, the Grand Forks Area Youth Baseball Association, the University of North Dakota Baseball Club, American Legion baseball, as well as the Grand Forks Public School District. Additionally, Kraft Field will be host to the 2025 North Dakota High School Baseball Tournament.

Minot Pump Track Project – Supplemental Grant Information Garrison Diversion Grant Request

Description of Project Features:

The Minot Park District is partnering with the Give360 Giving Circle (Minot Area Community Foundation) in developing Minot Park District property located west of the Jack Hoeven Park Baseball fields to construct a pump track.

The pump track would be a component of an overall master plan for this location, to include proposed plans for an inclusive playground with poured-in-place protective surfacing, vehicle parking, restroom building, and paved walking paths with connections to existing paths.

The goal is to construct two pump tracks that cater to a diverse range of needs. The first track will be designed for all ages and abilities, ensuring an inclusive experience for everyone. The second track will feature a fully handicap accessible loop as well as a dedicated “safety town” section tailored for our youngest riders. This track will offer additional programming opportunities for public safety education and adaptive sports group use.

Besides being an innovative play park amenity trending in more and more public spaces, a pump track is a track for wheeled sports equipment that, when ridden properly, does not require pedaling or pushing, but a “pumping” action to maintain momentum. A pump track is a loop that consists of a series of rollers (bumps or small hills in the track) and berms (corners). The “pump” part is the pushing-down and pulling-up action performed by riders in accordance with the structures design as the main source of propulsion. Pump tracks are designed this way so they can be ridden completely without the need for pushing and pedaling, making it relatively simple to use and caters to a wide variety of rider skill levels and accessible to wheelchairs.

Who does the program serve:

The Minot Pump Track will be owned and maintained by the Minot Park District, and accessible to all ages and abilities. The pump track will benefit not only the residents of Minot (50,000+) but also those from surrounding areas and visitors to come to our region in the summer months. With the nearest pump track located in Dunn Center, ND, the establishment of a pump track in Minot holds potential to serve a wider audience. The addition of connecting walking paths will integrate this project with existing amenities in the area, such as the Hoeven Ball Park and Wee Links Golf Course, transforming it into a destination for individuals of all ages and interests throughout the community. Furthermore, this initiative will seamlessly connect with the pre-existing citywide fitness paths, thereby ensuring enhanced accessibility for the entire Minot area.

The pump track provides an inclusive space where children of all ages and abilities can engage in physical activity, learn new skills, and foster social connections. By investing in this

project, all children have the opportunity to participate, promoting physical fitness and healthy lifestyles while nurturing their overall development.

Project Budget: \$300,000

\$300,000 is the amount that was quoted by EAPC for the completion of the pump track. This will include the groundwork and installation as well as additional site drainage required to keep water out of the recessed areas between the tracks.

The Minot Park District has engaged EAPC for the professional services of the location design. EAPC has engaged KLJ as civil engineering consultant, and EAPC will work directly with Pump Trax USA for the Pump Track course design.

Additional Funding Sources:

The Give360 Giving Circle has partnered with Minot Parks to fully fundraise the amount needed for the two pump tracks. Give360 was founded in 2011 as a community giving circle under the Minot Area Community Foundation. Its diverse membership embodies a collective commitment to addressing and surpassing the evolving needs of our community. Through annual financial contributions, members pool their resources to create a fund that is leveraged for significant community projects. Since inception, Give360 has invested over \$160,000 into the community.

Upon the announcement of fundraising for the pump track, Give360 committed \$30,000 towards it, with the intent to allocate more through annual membership donations.

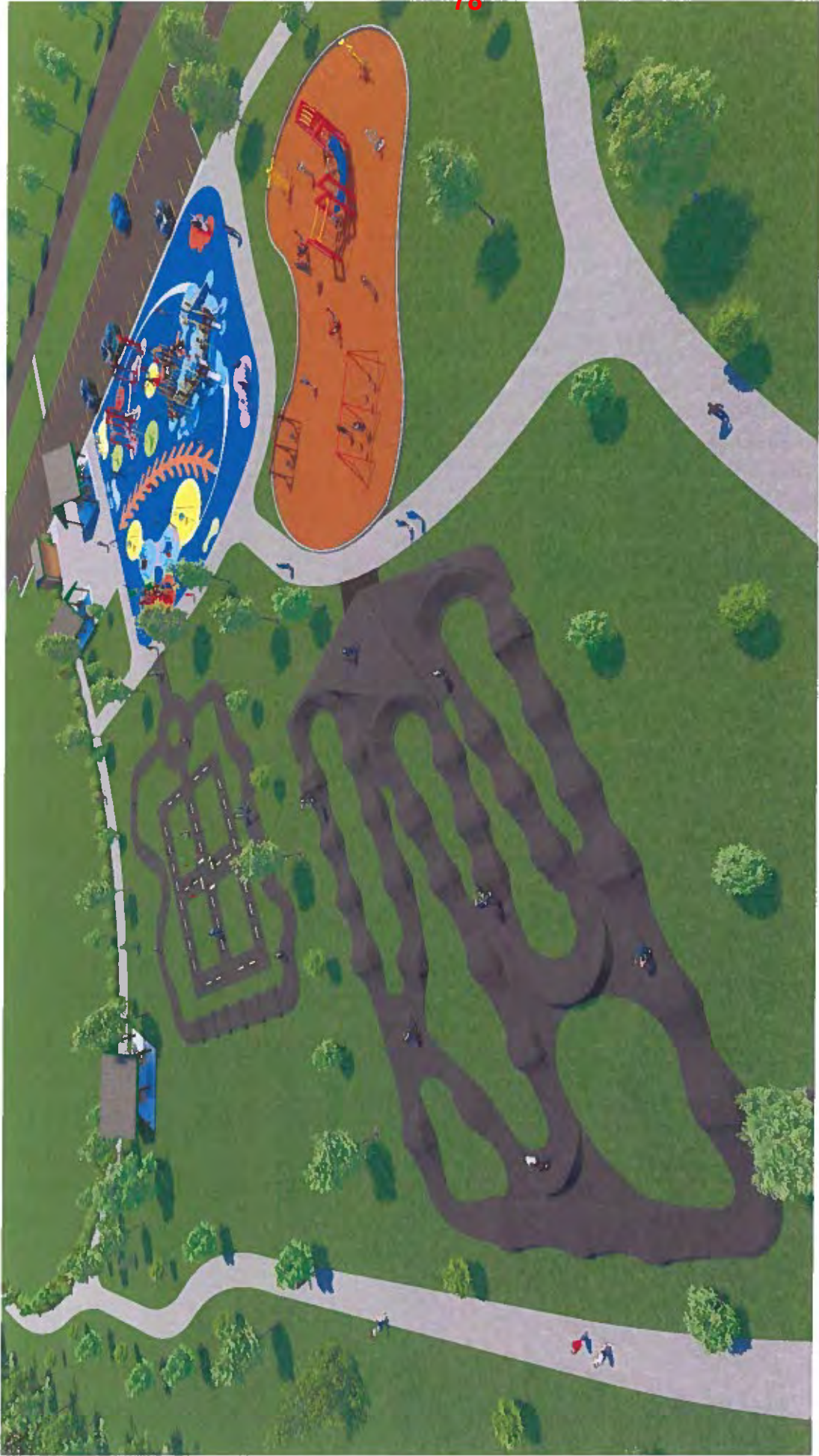

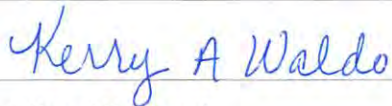

We look forward to partnering with you to expand our current Ice Skating Rink into a more comprehensive and accessible winter park space for all populations in Ellendale, North Dakota. The objective of a winter park is to offer a safe place for children and adults to spend time during our long winter months. A chance for everyone to get out of the house, do something fun, all while receiving some exercise.

Last winter was long for everyone, and it was hard being stuck in the house for days on end. The Ice Skating Rink helped serve our population and gave them the opportunity to be active and do something that benefits them both physically and mentally. ND law is different than other states that are the governing factor and some cities we deal with aren't even subject to any inspections of any kind.

We will build the splash pad with all VGB requirements, and we use the strictest guidelines for turnover rates to ensure safety for all involved.

AS of today 1/27/2022, the estimated amount for this pad.

Pad would be a light broom finish and if you wanted to upgrade to Rubber Rock it would be an upcharge of approximately \$10,800 but pricing would need to be verified.

Greetings,

Thank you for having me out yesterday and meeting with you and these are my findings.

1. Leak detection needed to find problem so skimmers are back up and running. 80 to 90% of pool flow needs to go through skimmers since this is where most of the bacteria is in a pool the top 18 inches.

This would need to be scheduled with our service team and for the day setting up sonar and checking the lines it can run up to \$4000.00. You can call 701-476-1732 and ask for Jake and he will get you setup

2. Small pool needs to have its own operation system with flow and chemicals, you are putting kids at risk as this pool should be turning over every 60 minutes and the large pool turnover rate is every 360 minutes.

I recommend the removal of the small pool and when funds are available replace with a splash pad there is enough room in the area for a 25 X 25 pad or 30 X 30 with a little expansion the price difference would be minor with a larger size.

3. PVC liner for large pool. This would make the pool interior maintenance free and we can add swim lane markings and that would be at no extra charge.

If this is something you would like to do it requires the following for payment. 10% down to get on the list 40% due to ship materials and 50% due upon completion. Rough estimate but need to put in contract form if interested and figure exact measurement but it would be approximately \$60,000

4. This is a highly inefficient pool with many plumbing flaws. The pool is being heated from resistant type electric heaters that are only 60% efficient.

The entire equipment room needs to be replumbed with correct size plumbing to meet VGB stands and velocity drop. The pump needs to be replaced with a high efficiency pump and an aqua drive system to save energy. A 20% reduction in pump speed is a 50% savings on electricity used and savings is \$1000 per year per HP. If pump curves show we can still use the 7.5 HP that is currently in pump room that would be a savings of \$7500 per year. Install high flow multiport valves for proper backwash, rinsing, and winterizing of sand filters.

Remove existing heaters 60% efficient and replace with heat pumps that are 450% efficient.

Water slide needs to have chemically treated water hooked up to it and remove city water for operation.

Replace diving board

Flow meters need to be operational and the current location is next to a 90-degree elbow and it can't be plumbed that way this would be done with new piping layout.

Eliminate (8) equalizer lines under skimmers and add auto fill system for pool. If you keep equalizer lines you need (8) VGB compliant covers.

Grant Project Narrative

Applicant: Fessenden Park District Project

Location: Fessenden City Park

1. Total Project Cost

We are estimating the cost to be \$197,000. We are asking for a grant of \$75,000.00. Fundraising will make up a great portion of the funding, but as of now we have raised approximately \$60,000 to be allocated for the Splash Pad project.

2. Project Description

The pool in Fessenden was built in the early 1960's and although the wading pool was added later, we do not have that exact date. Originally, the wading pool was on the same chemical/equipment system as the main pool. Because of the distance from the equipment room and the amount of water treated, the wading pool no longer met the requirements to stay on that system.

The project will consist of adding a brand-new splash pad which requires all new plumbing, skimmers, filters and equipment as well as an underground tank. The tank is required to properly circulate and treat the water.

We will replace the existing fencing and add an additional shed to house the splash pad equipment, the pool cover during the summer and storage for park equipment in the winter. The plumbing updates will create substantial savings in water usage and electricity as well as creating the flow needed to keep the water within the guidelines.

3. Project Planning

The pool has always been a major part of the park district's summer program. As the leaks became a serious issue last year, it was decided it was time to make a plan to repair the pool.

We began by hiring a company to come out and inspect the pool and make recommendations on the options available. Since the pool is a big part of the summer activities in our community, we felt the need to put the repairs at the top of the list for the coming years project list. Since the wading pool was condemned, a splash pad is the perfect addition to our park.

As community pools are vital to small towns as a source of outdoor recreation, it does meet SCORP requirements.

4. Public Involvement

We find that our community is very supportive in our goal to add a splash pad. We have had citizens approaching the board with questions about how they can donate, and citizens also offering to spearhead fundraising events to help cover the costs.

5. Operation and Maintenance

The day-to-day operation and maintenance will be handled by the Park Board and the employees hired and trained for that job. The winterizing of the pool/splash pad will be handled by a service that has the qualifications as winter seems to cause a lot of the damage.

Our pool serves as the first place a lot of local kids learn to swim; one thing our pool is known for is having the wading pool for younger siblings to enjoy while the bigger ones learn to swim. It also serves our families as a place to gather. It serves not only Fessenden, but other small towns that come for lessons and open swimming. Visitors to town also enjoy the park and pool and the campers at the campground within the park also have access to it.

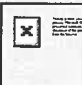

Recreation Grant Program Policy Statement

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT PROGRAM

The Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Board of Directors instituted a matching recreation grant program and established that funds for the grant program will consist of two-tenths of the mill levy Garrison Diversion receives. Grants may be requested for new recreation facilities and enhancement or expansion of existing facilities.

ELIGIBILITY

Political subdivisions (park boards, water resource districts and county or city commissioners, etc.) located within the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District may apply for a matching grant. **Community groups, service clubs and non-profit organizations are not eligible to apply for funding.**

Single-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible to receive up to 25% of the non-federal share. Multiple-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible for up to 50% of the non-federal share. To be considered for a 50% non-federal cost share, more than one county must contribute substantial funds to the project.

SCOPE OF PROJECTS

Eligible projects may encompass a variety of components which provide actual, or are a complement to, natural resource outdoor recreational opportunities. Projects may include, but are not limited to: boat ramps and docks; picnic facilities; restrooms; campgrounds; bathhouses; playground areas; and bicycle, pedestrian, or horse trails.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Recreation Committee meets biannually to consider grant applications. Application and required documentation must be postmarked or received electronically by March 1 or September 1 to be considered at the next meeting.

The application must include, but not be limited to:

1. Audience intended to be served
2. Breakdown of estimated costs, including future operations and maintenance
3. Predicted source of all funding
4. Plans for new construction

GUIDELINES FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- Applications must include a list of all funding sources applied for and amounts received.
- All projects must have long-term managing partners with operation and maintenance funds available for the life of the project.
- Applicants requesting \$25,000 or more are encouraged to attend the Recreation Committee meeting to present the project and answer questions from the committee.

ELIGIBLE PROJECT COSTS

Site planning costs, including engineering costs, may be included as eligible project costs. Individual projects are eligible to receive up to a maximum of \$75,000 award.

Only costs incurred after the date of grant approval by Garrison Diversion will be eligible for reimbursement.

Money to be credited as the local sponsor's share of the project may be raised in a number of ways and may consist of actual dollars or in-kind donations of labor, materials and equipment costs.

NON-ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Types of projects or elements of projects that are not qualified to receive funding:

1. Maintenance of an existing facility/structure, i.e. painting/staining, re-roofing, etc.
2. Any type of facility used for maintenance equipment or the purchase of maintenance equipment
3. Development, enhancement or maintenance of roads to or within facilities
4. Water lines, sewer lines and electrical services to facilities other than immediate hookups.
5. Projects on private property without a public interest to the land
6. Projects on school property
7. Shore stabilization including riprap
8. Any project that does not meet current ADA standards
9. Land acquisition costs will not be considered eligible for reimbursement; the land valuation may not be credited toward the local sponsor's match.
10. Projects that do not allow reasonable access by the public
11. Golf courses, hockey arenas, monument type veteran/public servant memorials, or art/theatre projects

If your submitted application includes any of the non-qualified components listed above, the application will be returned for resubmission before the corresponding deadline.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPROVED GRANTS

Following completion of the project and verification of expenditures, reimbursement will be made by Garrison Diversion. Partial payment requests may be made at the discretion of the project sponsor. Projects receiving grants over \$5,000 will be provided a sign, paid for by the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, naming major sponsors of the project.

Approved recreation projects have three years to be completed. If the project has not been completed within that time frame, the sponsoring agency will need to report to the Recreation Committee in order to retain any unused funds, or the unused funds will be returned to Garrison Diversion's recreation grant pool.

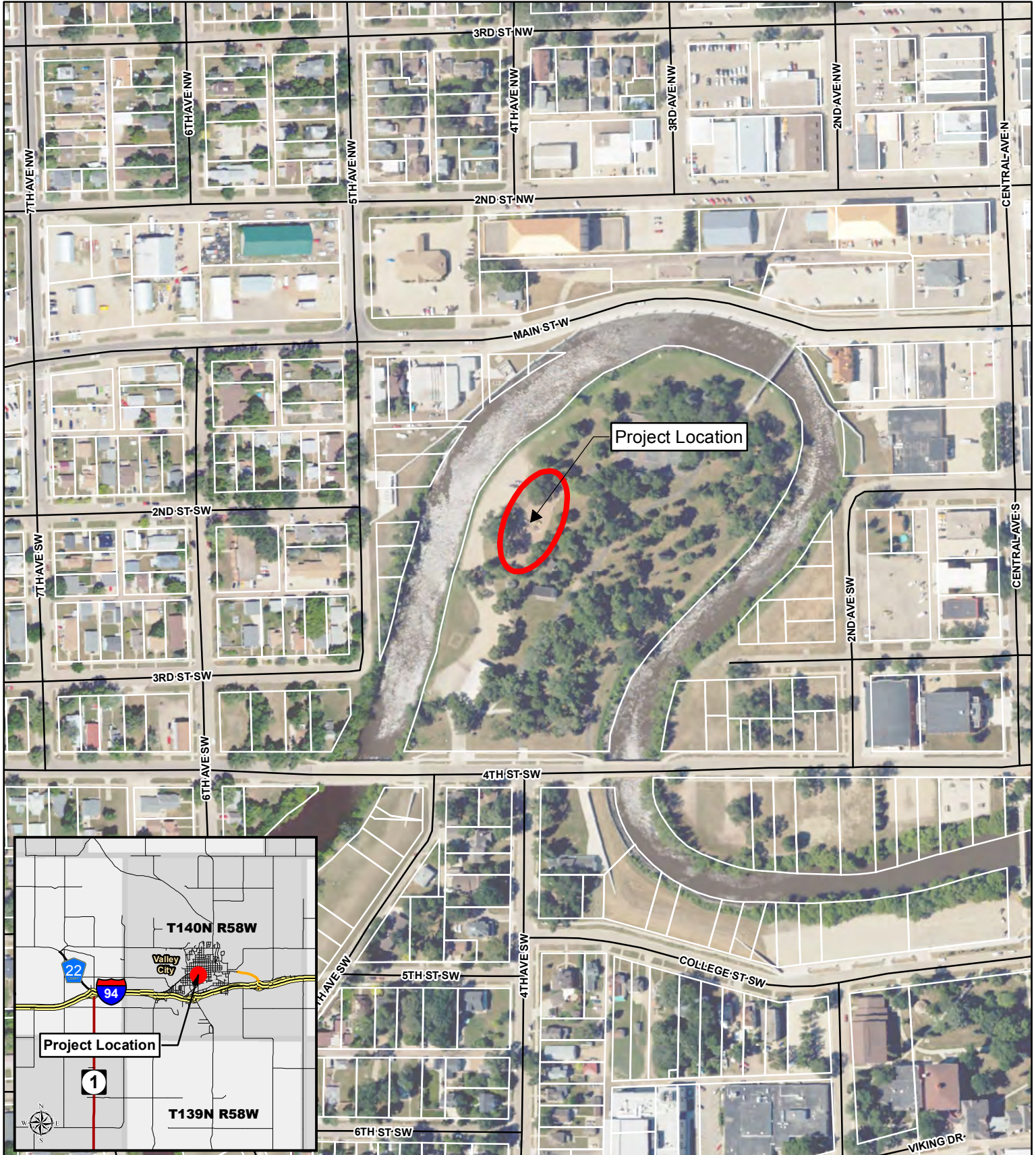

This document includes assessments of existing facilities, identifying issues/concerns, input by user groups, identified project goals, developed preliminary concepts and budget estimating costs for proposed improvements to Bismarck Municipal Ballpark. The purpose of this document is to provide a master plan to facilitate incremental or wholesale steps to upgrade the ballpark facilities and provide for current and future users' needs.

This study categorizes the information in the following way: documented Issues and concerns, user group input on their wants and needs, design ideas/proposed improvements and cost estimates.

The process has been collaborative, involving the Bismarck Park and Recreation District, District executive and field staff, Bismarck Youth Baseball, Babe Ruth Baseball, American Legion Baseball, Bismarck Public Schools high school athletics, Bismarck State College athletics, University of Mary athletics and Northwoods League – Bismarck Larks staff. Our goal was to establish both functional needs and simple improvements to the ultimate proposed improvements. Proposed improvements have been prioritized and may be adjusted due to functional or budget decisions made by the District and other stakeholders in this process.

- Artificial turf: The need for early spring use, more consistent play, heavy use of the facility, turnaround after rain/weather events, and maintenance staff requirements have all contributed to the preference to convert the field from natural grass to artificial turf.

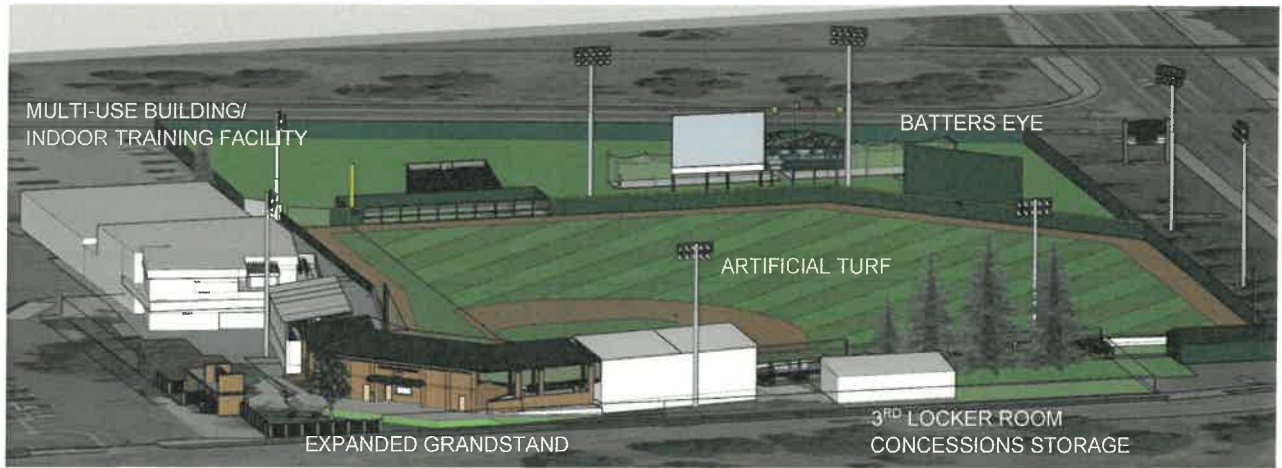
- Following the initial masterplan and full renovation of the field into a highly regarded ballpark, along with the improvements made that were included in the Phase 2 master plan, the ballpark should continue to adapt to the changing needs of the user groups and District staff
- The ballpark has continued to evolve with additional bleachers, some new alternate type seating areas (deck area), protective netting, upgraded LED field lighting, new video board and scoreboard and additional parking lot lighting and miscellaneous smaller projects. The majority of the previously identified needs/wants have been completed.
- As a community field, consideration needs to be given to the needs of all the user groups.
- Although the switch to artificial turf had been a consideration during the Phase 1 and Phase 2 masterplans, current needs and circumstances has pushed the change toward the top of the priority list.
- Having small storage rooms/areas to store and secure team equipment for each team was requested.
- The user groups indicated that an indoor training facility is something the community of Bismarck needs. Many of the major communities in the state have them.
- Continue to provide for a great fan experience.
- Continue to provide shade, comfortable seating, good sightlines. Additional concessions areas to reduce the number of portable tents.
- Northwoods League staff noted that fans like alternative seating types and group seating areas such as bar rail seating, table seating and corporate group seating is preferred. Bleachers are hard to sell.
- A multi-use building could be a unifying presence for all levels of baseball with better/more locker rooms, offices, trainers' area, Bismarck baseball history area, Indoor training facility, commercial kitchen for improved concessions, meeting areas, storage and possibly even office space to allow the Larks to be located at the ballpark.
- Better access to the area north of the outfield fence could provide for many opportunities/improvements.
- Provide a restroom to be utilized by the visiting team's bullpen without having to walk in to use the public restrooms.
- Improvements to other fields (Haaland & Tatley) to be considered as baseball expands within the community.

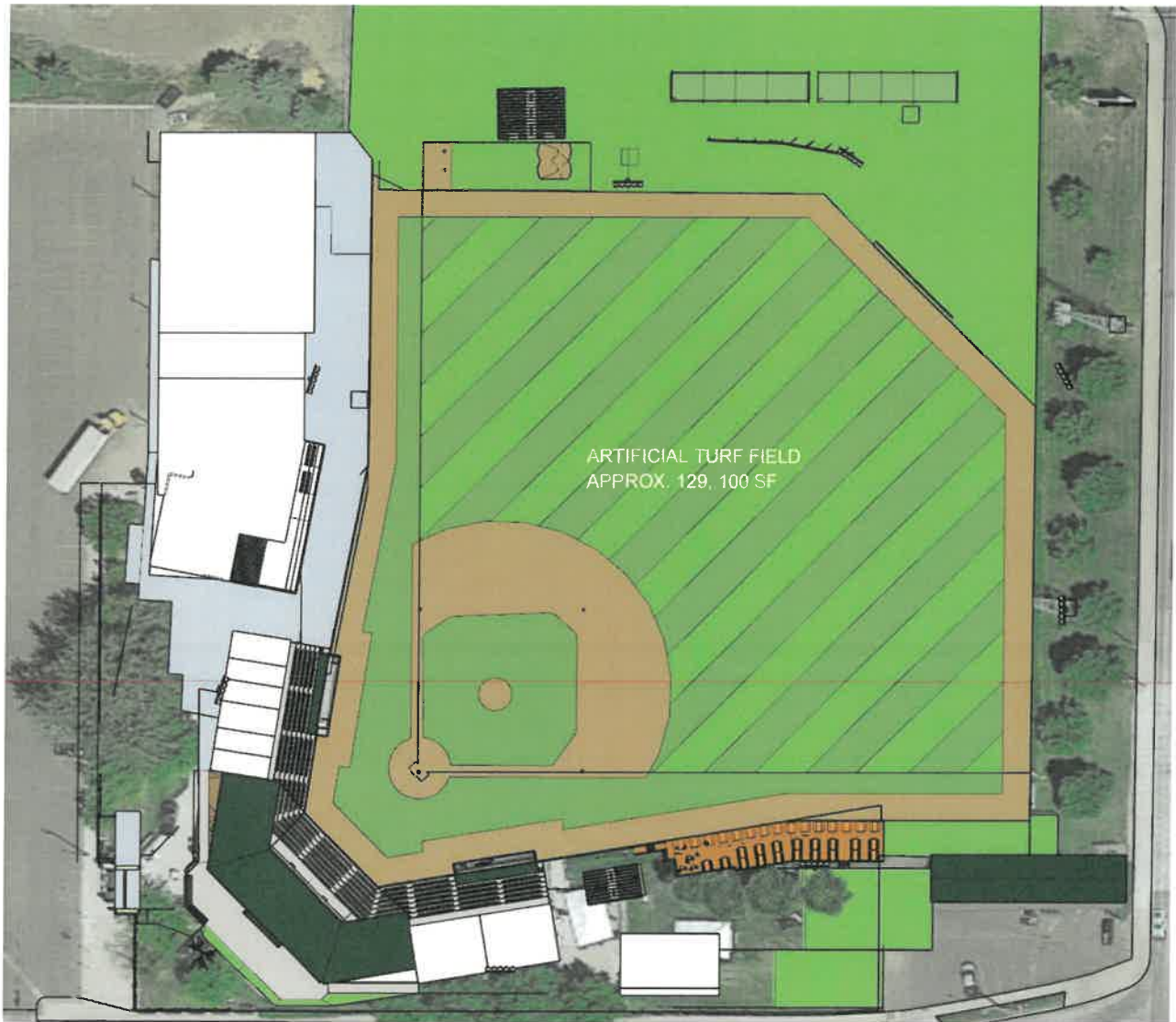

1 –Artificial Turf Field

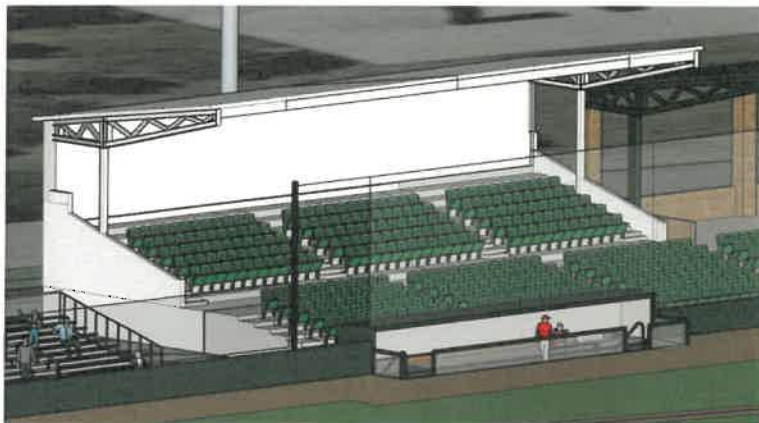

Replacement of the aluminum bleachers with new permanent grandstand construction that would allow additional stadium seating along with tiered table seating and bar rail type seating including shade canopies. The space underneath could be utilized to provide additional concessions, storage, etc. The type/density of the seating would reduce the seating capacity by approximately 90 which would need to be accommodated at another location within the ballpark, possibly down the third base fence line.

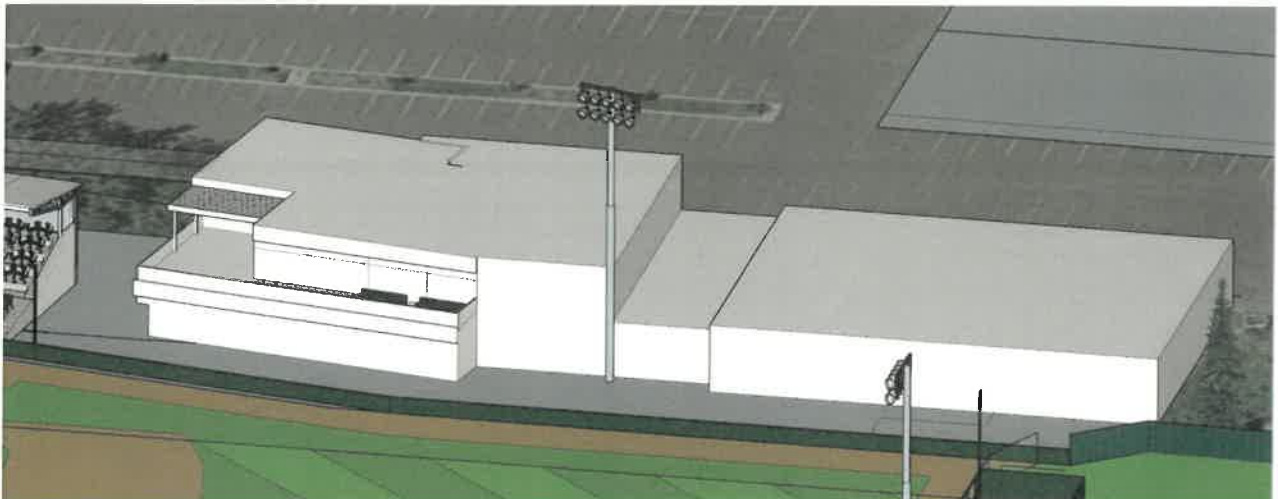
3 – Batters Eye

Installation of a 60' wide x 30' high batters eye to provide a solid background for the safety of batters by allowing batters to better pick up of the ball from the pitcher's hand vs. against the backdrop of the surroundings.

4 – Multi Use Building / Indoor Training Facility

Construction of a new 28,600 SF multi level structure with main level to include 2 locker rooms with restrooms & showers, a sports medicine room, public restrooms, permanent merchandising area, Bismarck baseball history museum, laundry, commercial kitchen, storage, and indoor training facility (85'x110'), and an upper level with a large meeting room, Larks operations offices, 4 small suites and rooftop group seating areas. 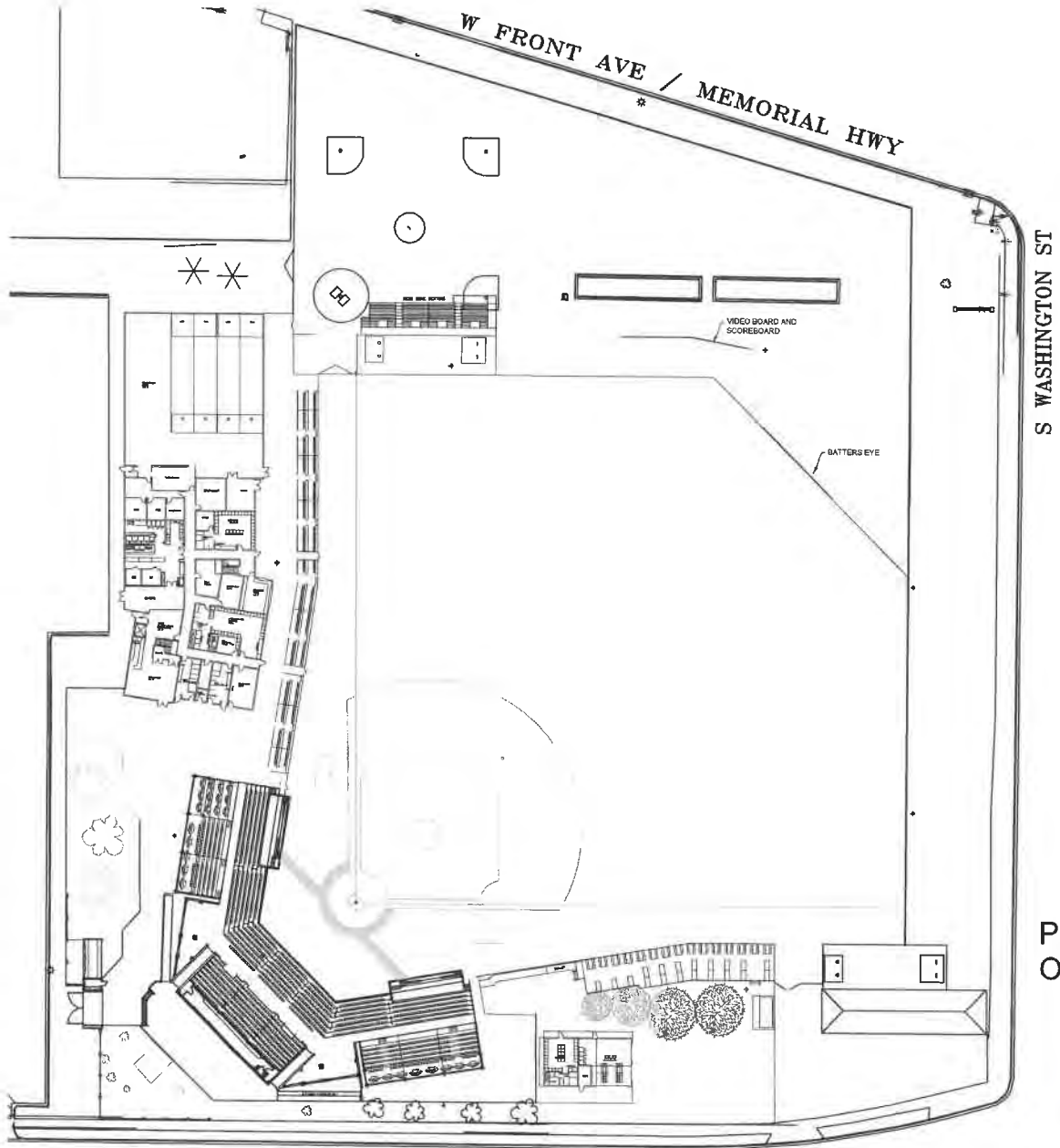
Summary:

The improvements proposed could increase the ballpark seating capacity from 1900 to approximately 2300 with all options completed. Increasing the seating capacity would require adding one additional parking space at a ratio of one space for five additional seats. Increasing the seating capacity to 2300 would require adding eighty (80) additional parking spaces that would require converting the area currently utilized as the community garden space into parking, thus requiring relocation of the community garden to a new location. Previous preliminary parking lot expansion studies indicate the community garden area could accommodate an additional 80 spaces. The cost for the additional parking lot is included within this masterplan report.

Adding the multi-purpose building would require removal of the existing clubhouse/restroom building. The displaced restrooms would be replaced and expanded within the multi-purpose building to accommodate the required restroom facilities for the expanded capacity. The placement of the new multi-purpose building would also require relocation of the current ice rink and warming house.

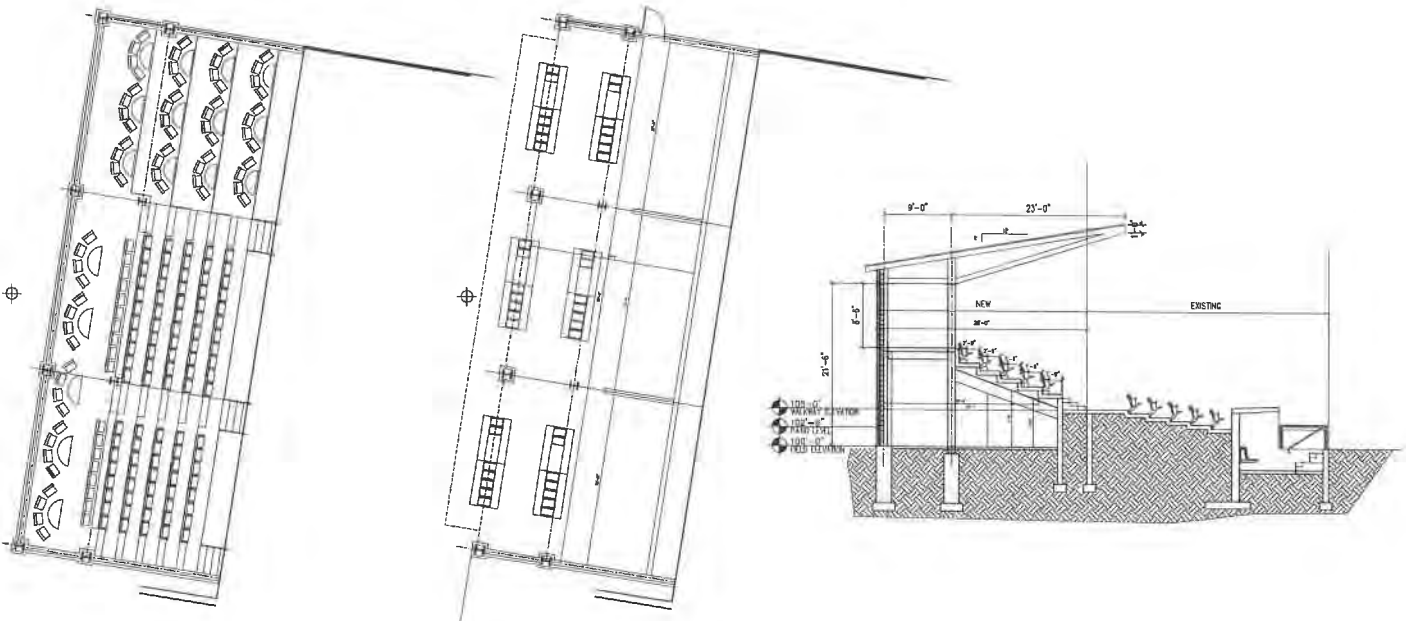
Proposed Preliminary Plans

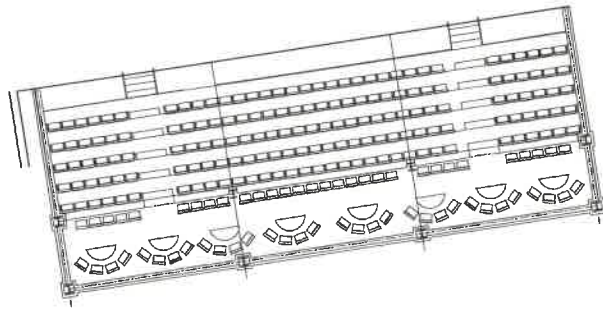

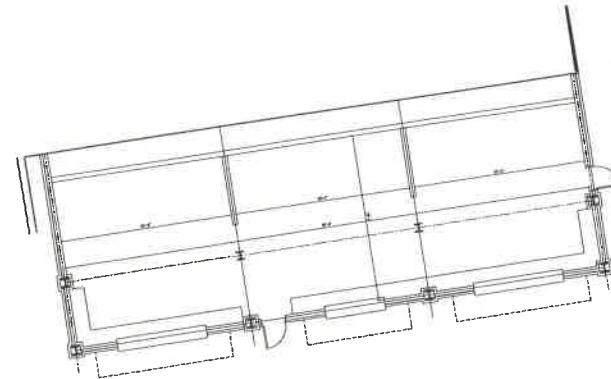

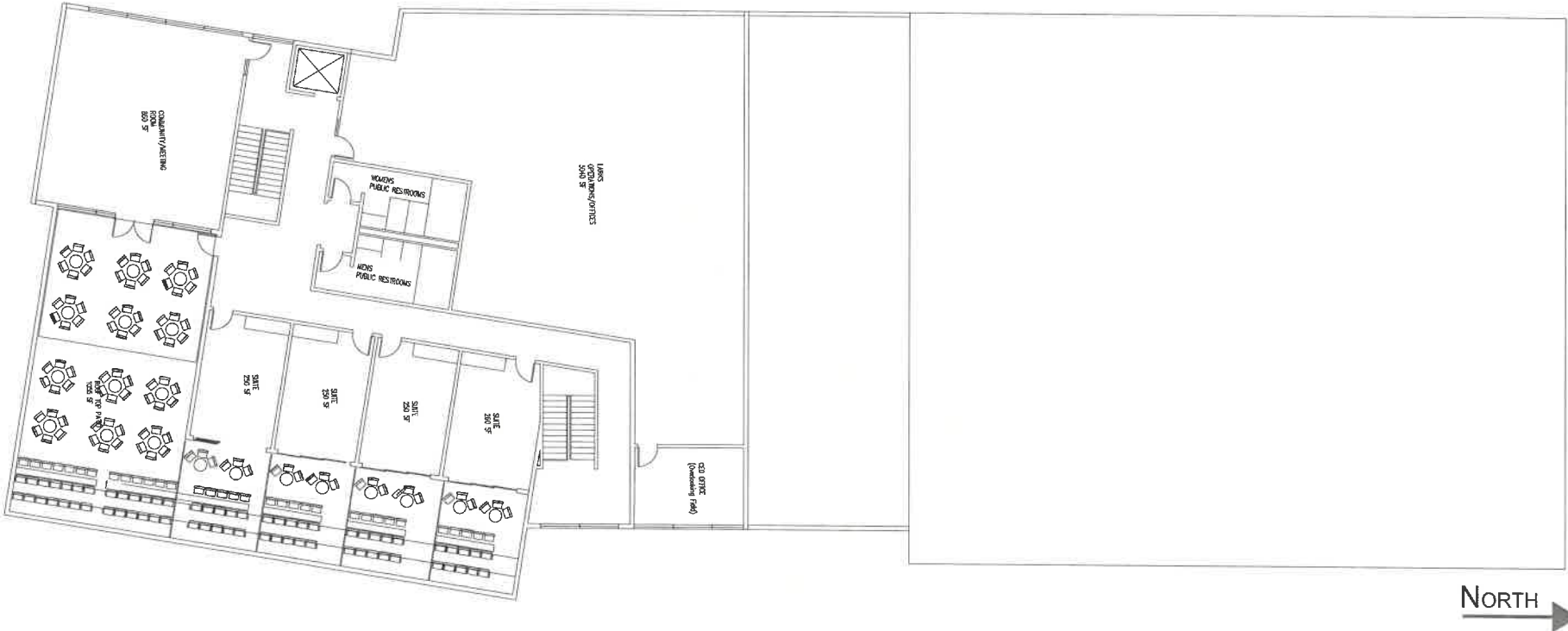

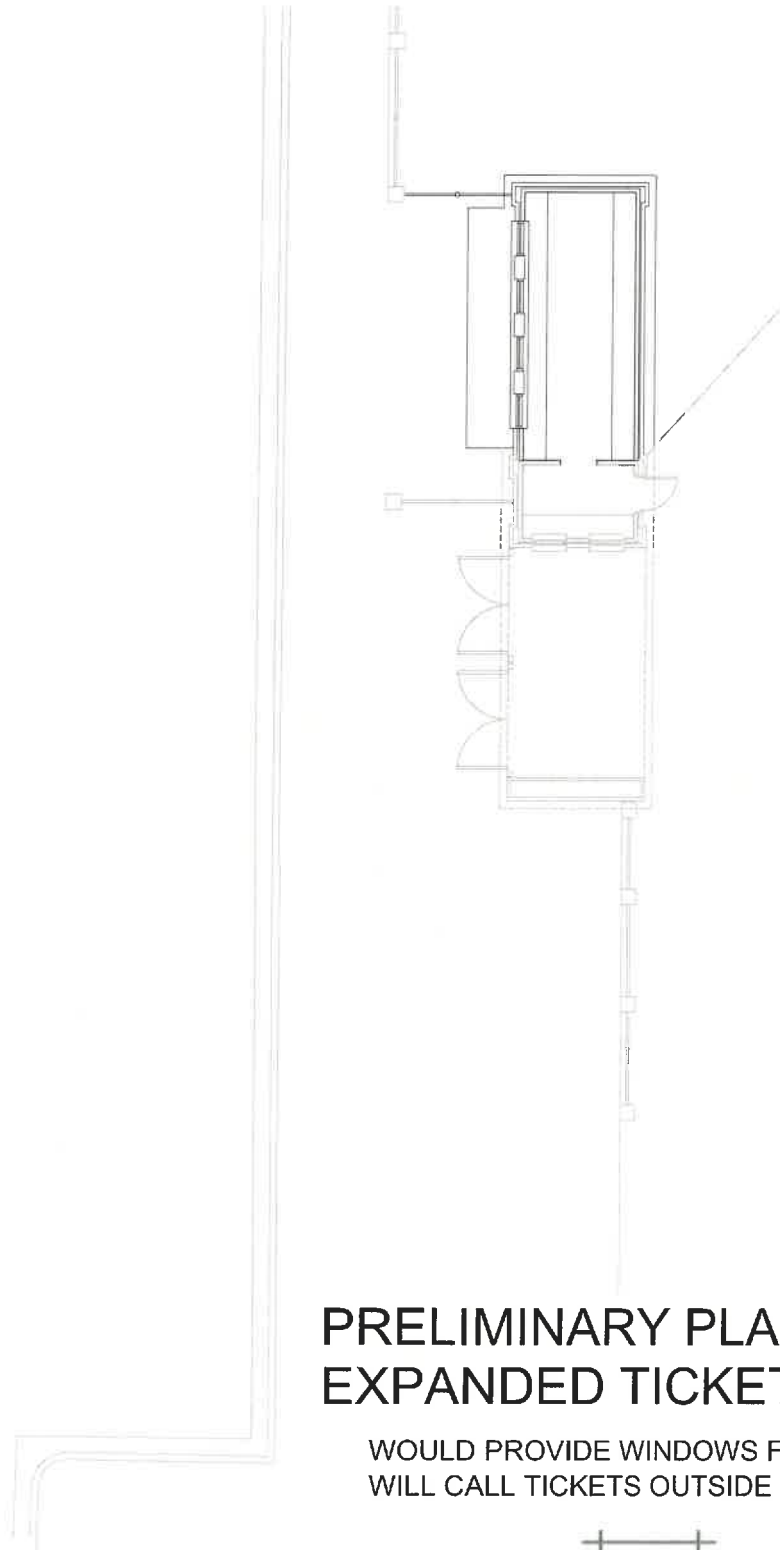

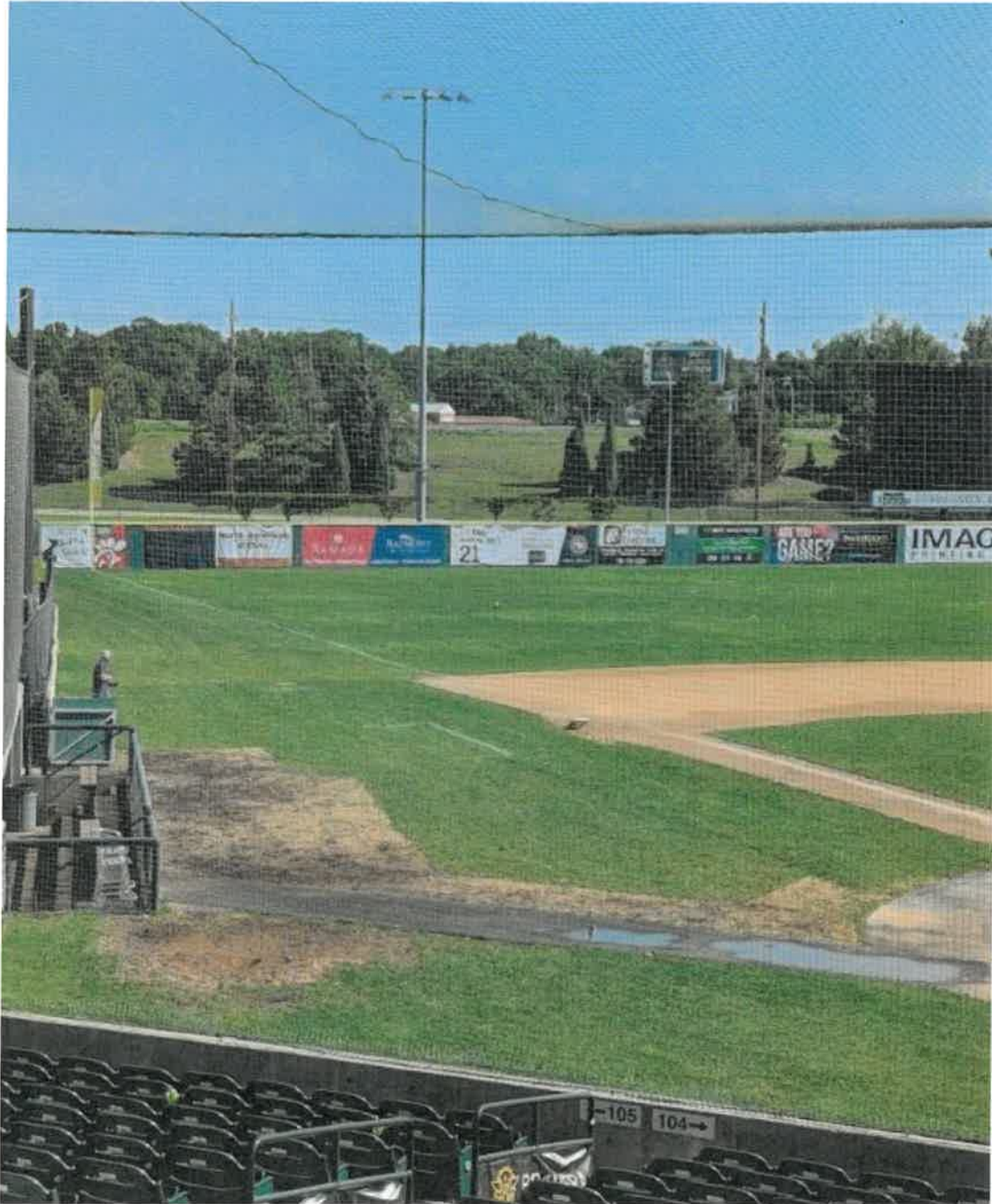
Location Map – Municipal Ballpark



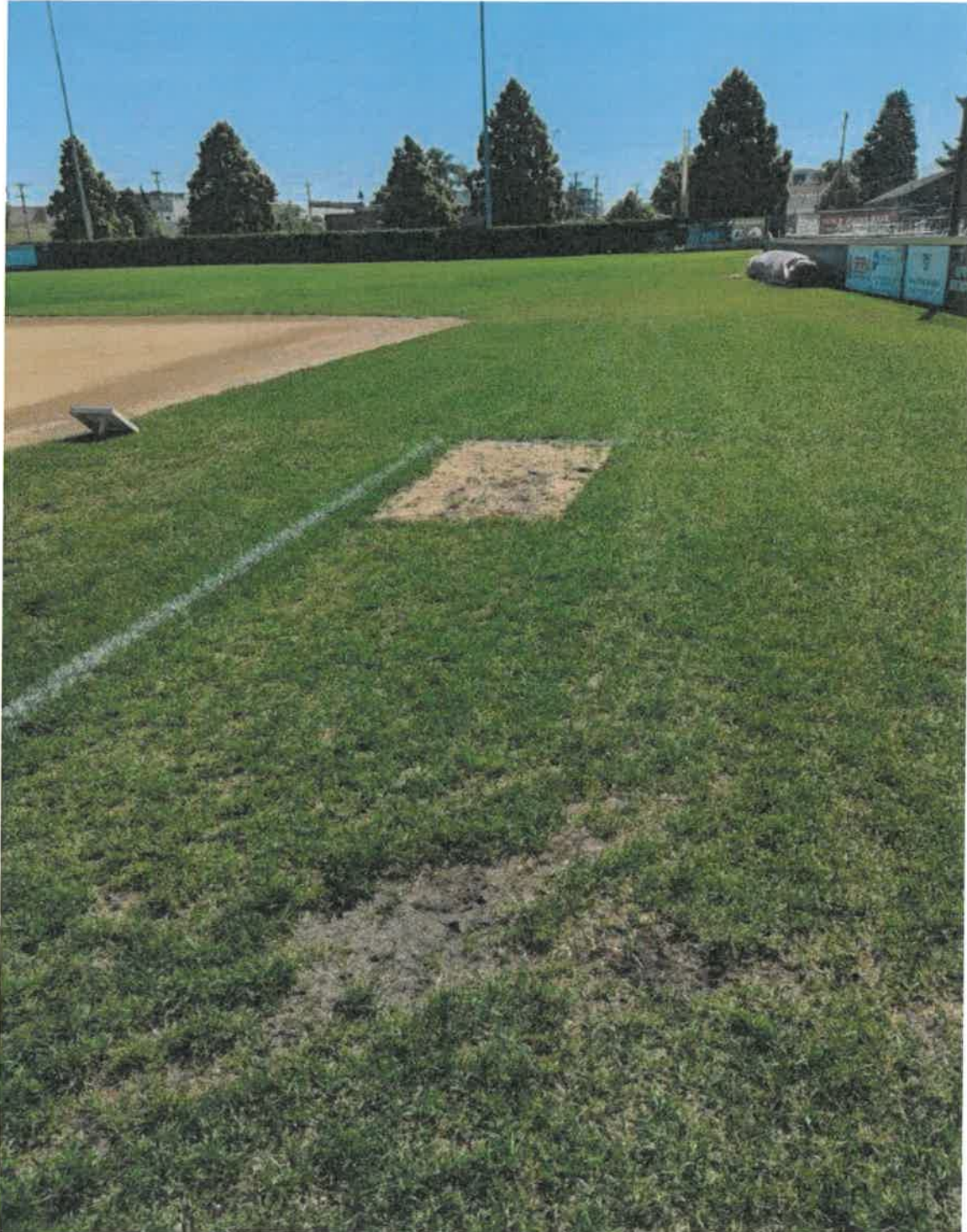

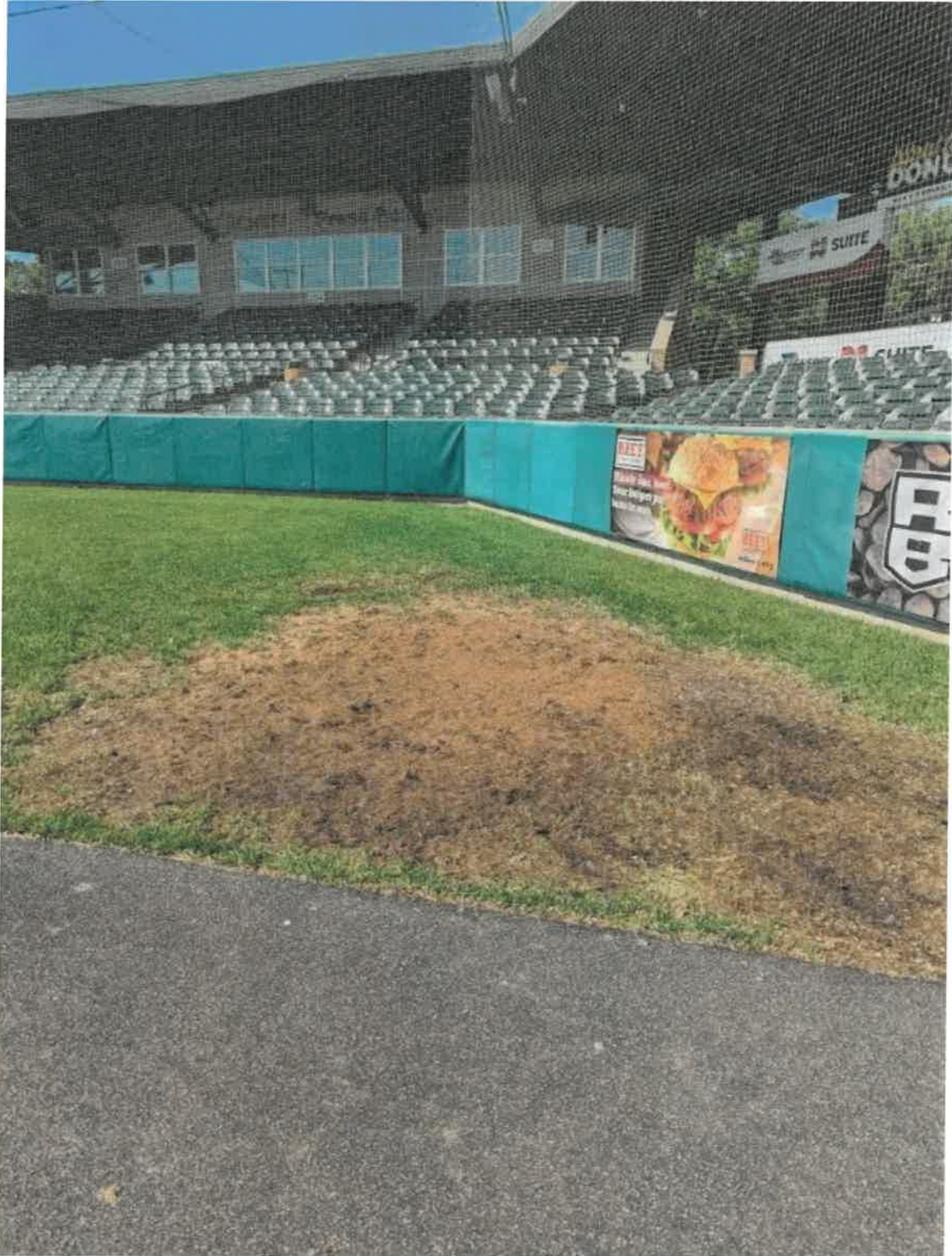

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

Rheault Farm is located on 15-acres and owned and operated by the Fargo Park District. The park features a picnic shelter, bunkhouse, playground, brick farmhouse, barn, granary, year-round restrooms, and a Quonset. Rheault Farm is home to a variety of festivals, events, rentals, and classes all year long. The house and barn were originally built in 1918-19 by owner Sanford Johnson with brick from the Fargo Brick Company. Ernest Rheault bought the farm in 1949 and his son George continued to farm the land until 1979 when it was acquired by the Fargo Park District. The Fargo Park District has identified the current playground structure as a needed replacement within the park district due to the age, use, condition, and the need to improve accessibility within the park. The existing playground was manufactured by Miracle Recreation and was installed at the farm in June of 1999. The new playground installation will improve play value, accessibility, and update the play equipment with a farmed-themed playground structure to match the surrounding park amenities of Rheault Farm. The current plastic border will be replaced with a permanent concrete border, and three shade shelter pad and benches will be installed to provide seating for park users.

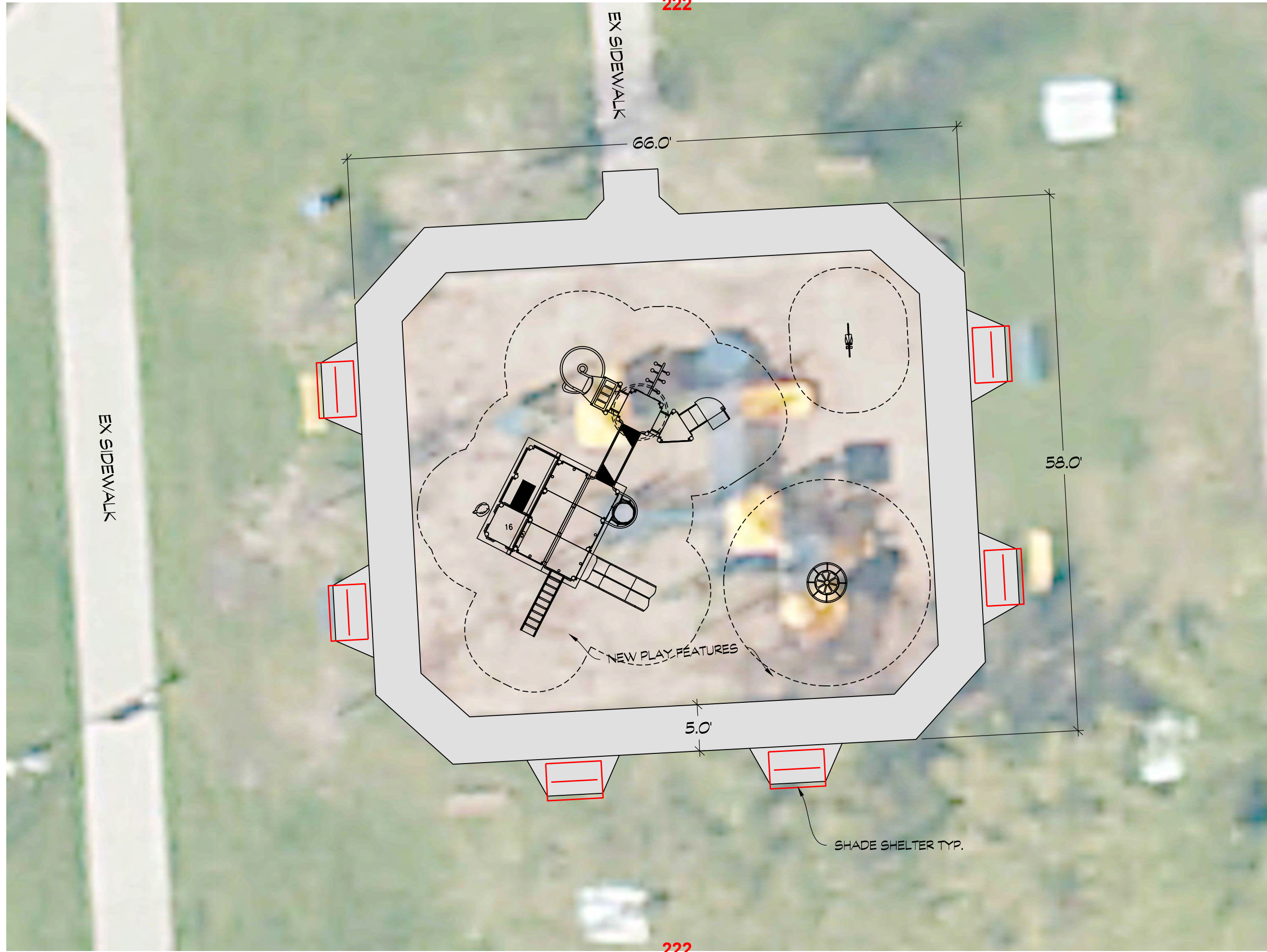

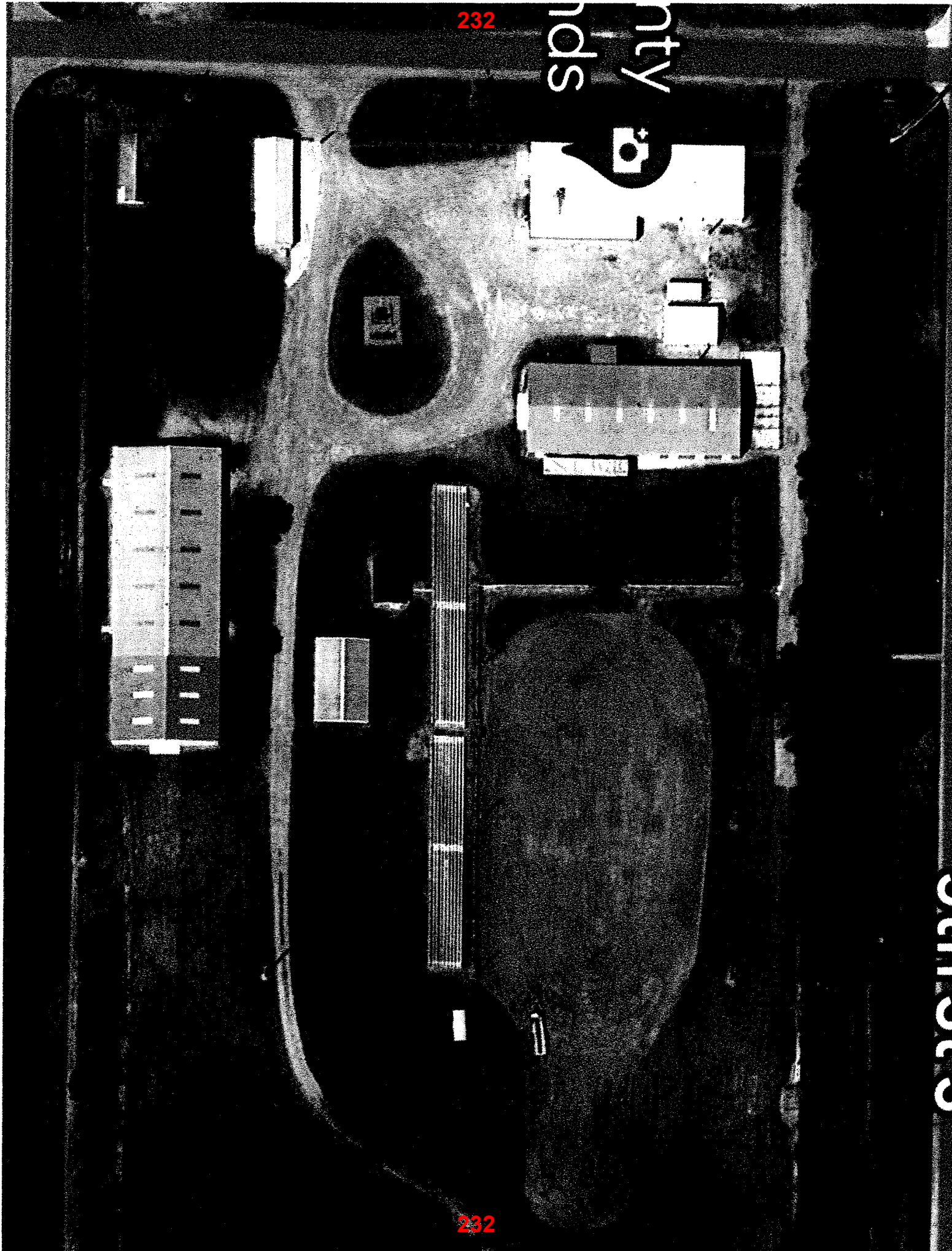

Description of Grand Valley Playground Project

Crary Development, in Grand Forks, ND has committed to a large housing development project in south Grand Forks. The concept includes a first phase of 119 residential lots, with a roughly 10 acre parcel for low density multi-family residential, a roughly 11 acre pond and roughly a 10 acre park. The park will be owned, operated and maintained by the Grand Forks Park District.

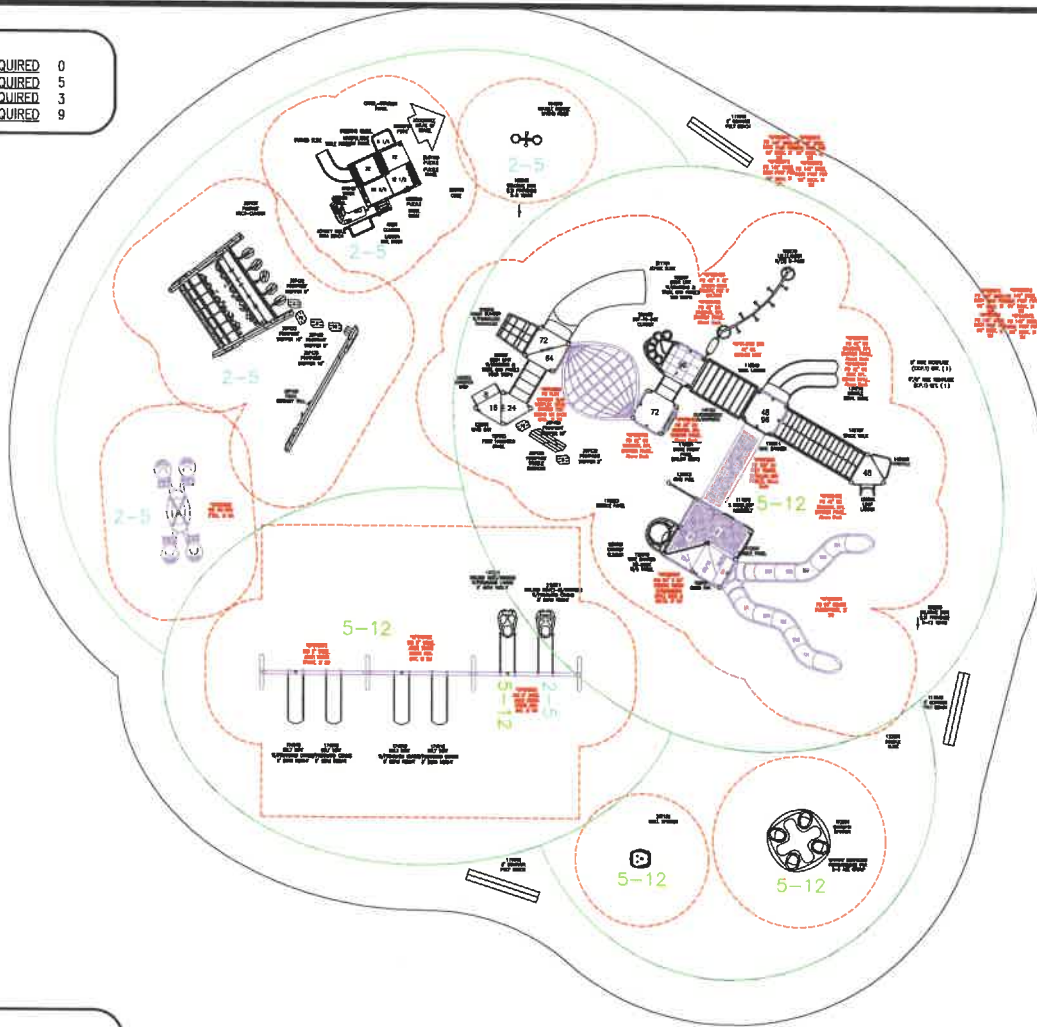
The premise of the development, since the beginning, has been to create a neighborhood that utilizes our environment and to create a year-round asset not only for the neighborhood but a destination for others in the community to come and enjoy. Plans for a warming house, or community room, along with an ice-skating loop would feature winter activity, while walking and biking trails, a family games area, unique landscaping and a playground would be featured in the summer months.

Initial commitments from Crary Development of a \$500,000 pledge to kickstart the park along with a \$500,000 grant from the North Dakota Parks and Recreation Department will go a long way to help in the initial phases of development. Plans for a parking lot, bike and walking paths, restrooms and landscaping are expected to be part of this first phase and use most of those funds.

The Grand Forks Park District would like to construct a new state of the art playground in this new park during the first phase of construction as well. The expected costs of the new playground are around \$400,000, and we are asking the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District for a 25% matching grant of \$75,000 for the new playground.

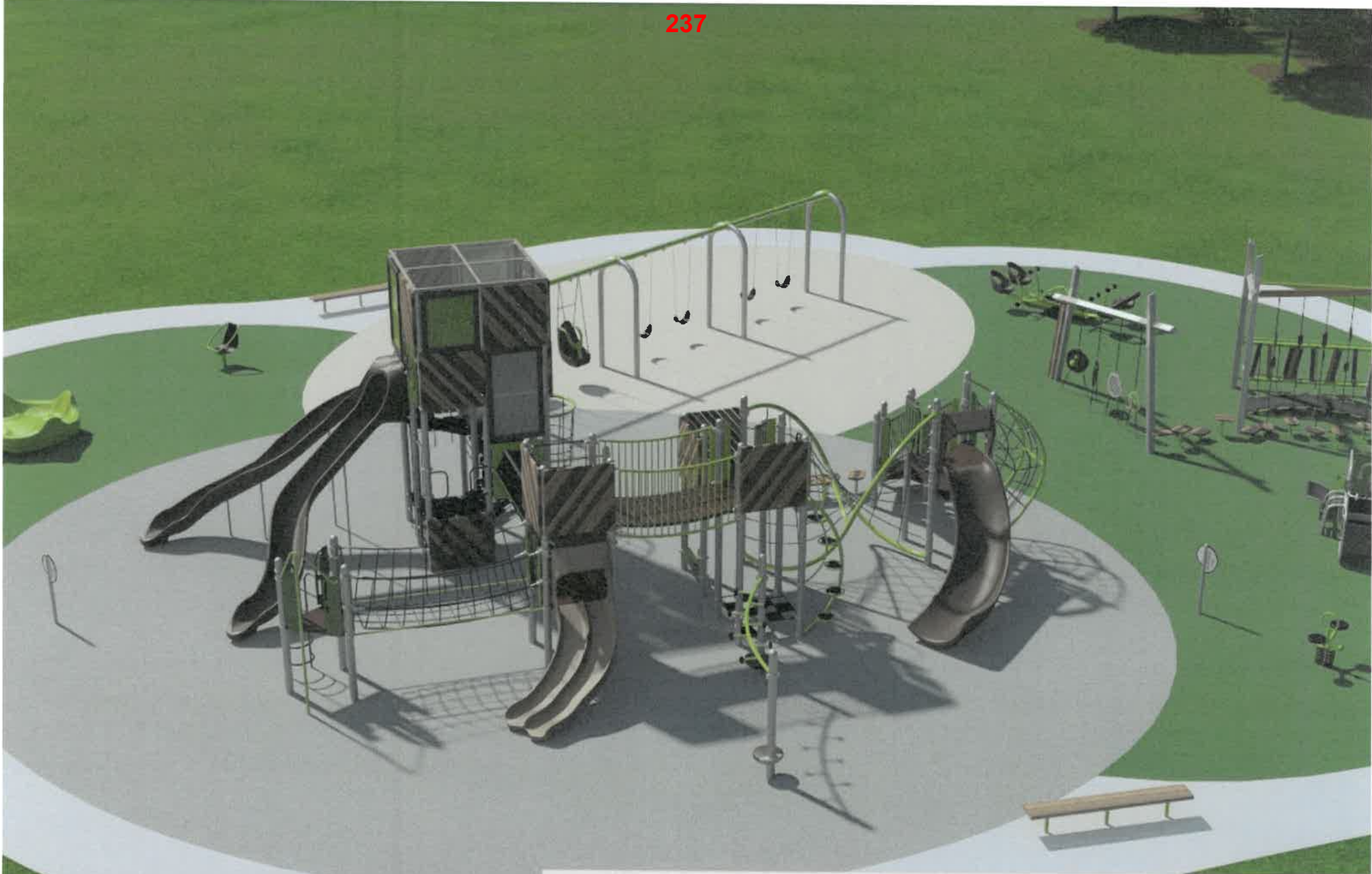

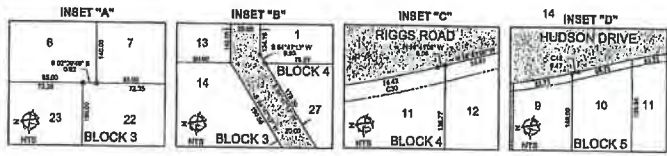

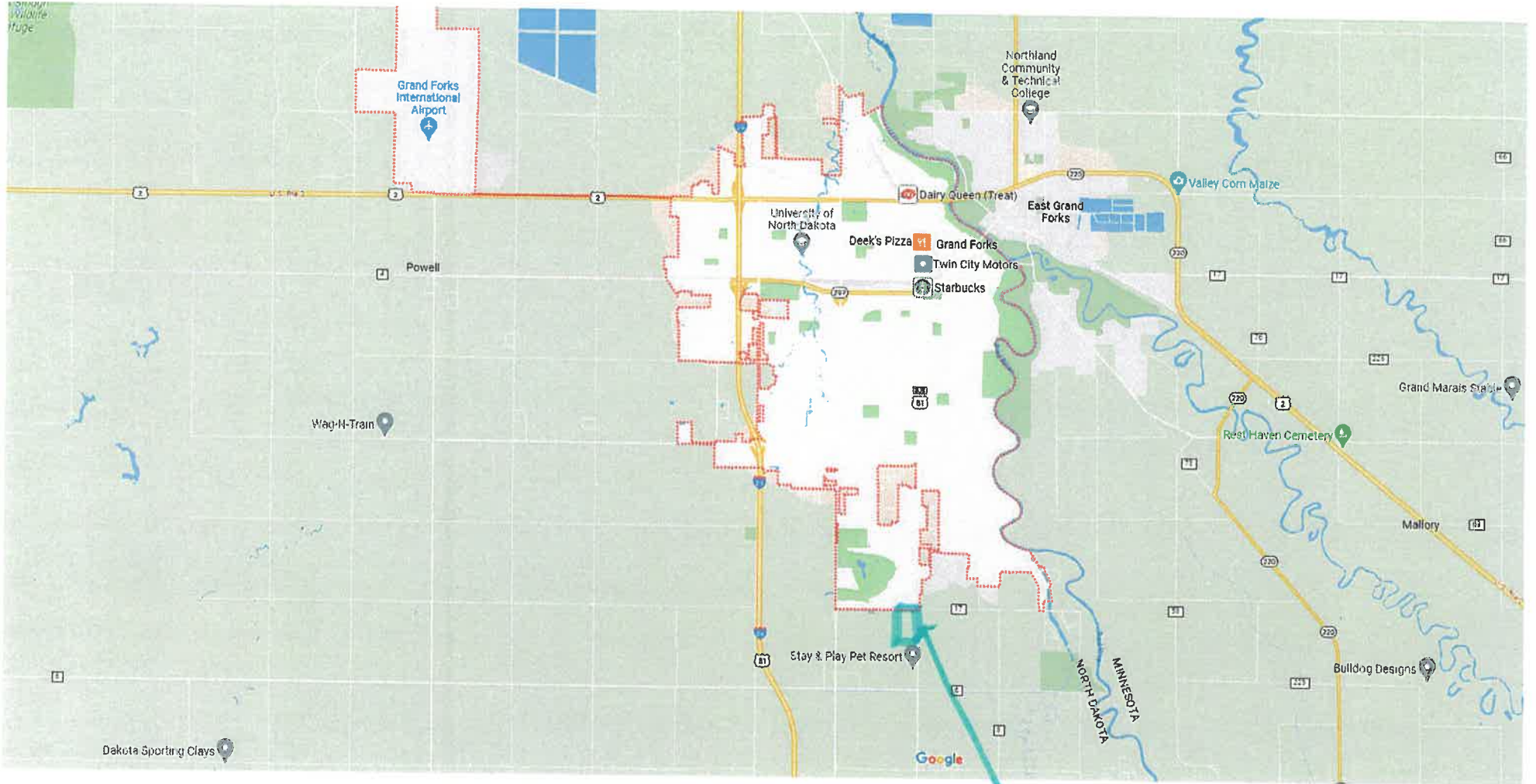

Describe the Project Site As Is and Proposed Changes (Tree Removal, Drainage Filled, Etc.):

The present condition is undeveloped land bordered by an earthen levee, homes, and the Red River. A storm pond is located in the middle of the property. The area adjacent to the river is heavily forested and will require some thinning. The fishing site is an ad hoc site with no amenities. The lack of paved surfaces limits law enforcement and emergency services from accessing the site during wet weather.

The first step will be to remove some trees along the outside edge of the wooded area. This will provide more space for a paved shared-use path from the existing greenway to the fishing area. Once the trees have been cleared away, an extension will be added to the height of the existing retaining wall at the fishing site. This retaining wall is part of the storm pond outfall at the fishing site. This is meant to increase the safety of all users, as the current wall was not built to have people in the area. Finally, the trail and fishing area will be paved, and user amenities will be installed. This area is subject to periodic flooding, and pavement will make the area more accessible for maintenance and rescue staff.

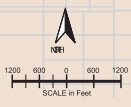

The flood of 1997 dramatically altered the landscape of Grand Forks and East Grand Forks. More than 56,000 people were evacuated before waters of the Red and Red Lake Rivers crested at a record high level of 54 feet. Seventy-five percent of Grand Forks and ninety-five percent of East Grand Forks were inundated with water. The cities made national headlines as eleven of Grand Forks' downtown buildings burned. To ensure that Greater Grand Forks would be protected against future flooding, the US Army Corps of Engineers proposed the construction of a flood protection system, including a Greenway, along the Red and Red Lake rivers.

The Greenway provides a unique opportunity for year-round outdoor recreational activities in the Greater Grand Forks area. With approximately 2,200 acres of open space, vegetation, and recreational amenities, there's something for everyone in the Greenway.

Project Plan

Hero's Park will aim to turn an unused space next to the Gwinner Community Center into a welcoming park honoring our veterans and bringing together members of our community.

Current Space

The location occupies a 92' x 21' corner on Main Street. It consists of a 68' x 21' concrete area and a 24' x 21' dirt area with a side walk leading up to the building. The entirety of the area is surrounded by a chain-link fence.

Renovation Plans

Hero's Park will make use of the existing concrete slab to conserve resources, both environmental and financial. The slab will host a large pergola, approximately 18' x 26', to provide shade to five six-foot picnic tables. Two granite memorial stones honoring our veterans will also be placed on the concrete slab. The stones will measure approximately 6 feet high with inscriptions and art to be determined as we work with the artists that design these. We will add additional functional items such as garbage cans as well. We will be removing the existing fence and adding a dedication plaque to the park.

The dirt portion of the park will receive a beautiful transformation to promote green spaces in our community. Two trees will provide shade to the area. We will plant poppy seeds and milkweed plants in the new garden area. The poppy flowers will serve as an homage to Flanders Fields, a major battle theatre on the Western Front during World War I. Milkweed is a vital part of the metamorphosis of the monarch butterfly, an endangered species that makes their spring-fall home in North Dakota. The dirt portion will also utilize the existing side walk to make this area accessible, furthering our desire to make the best use of our resources. Additional seating space will be provided in this area with two park benches.

We do believe the grant will cover the entire cost of the project. We do understand there may be costs that exceed the grant and incidental expenses. We are prepared to fundraise for the remaining funds needed. Fundraisers such as dedication bricks to be purchased placed next to the walkway of the park and in-kind donations from local businesses and residents have been discussed.

Description of Project

This project will create an inclusive environment for the community, specifically individuals with disabilities, by renovating the playground, picnic shelter, restroom, parking area and pathways at Nickeus Park in Jamestown.

Nickeus Park is a flag ship park consisting of 6.77 acres in the Jamestown Parks and Recreation system. It is located at 7th Street and 1st Ave North in an elbow of the James River. The river surrounds the park on three sides of the property and includes mature landscape. This project will rehabilitate and replace the existing playground, picnic shelter, and restroom. In addition, it will create a designated off-road parking area and add paved pathways to the park.

Inclusive playground equipment is about ALL children having equal access to participate in play regardless of ability, age or comfort level. While children won't always be able to participate in every activity, the intent is to offer ALL children a variety of activities at varying levels of difficulty within the same place space. In addition to the playground, the park support features such as parking, shelter, and restrooms will also be fully accessible.

This renovation will create a destination and gathering space for the community. The playground is designed to help children have fun and develop age-appropriate skills that transcend the playground! Swings, slides, spinners, climbers, sensory, music, overheads and more bring so much play value to each of these exciting spaces. In addition to the playground the renovation will add a large picnic shelter at this location and a restroom to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities.

Justification of Project

Jamestown has an immense need for updated play equipment and accessible restroom facilities in our parks. When complete Nickeus Park will be the ONLY fully accessible outdoor facility within our system of parks. In addition to the renovated components of the park, Nickeus Park also includes a dock to access the waterway trail of the James River. The additional parking area will support and meet the needs of kayakers as they access the waterway.

Integration Into Comprehensive Plan: The current strategic plan identifies the need to update and maintain park playground equipment as a primary objective. A public input meeting was held on 5/24/2023 to discuss the state of parks and playgrounds in the community of Jamestown and to begin to form a vision for the future. The attendees shared their concerns regarding safety, lack of adequate restrooms, desire to make the parks inclusive for individuals with disabilities, need to update play equipment, concern for pedestrian and bicyclist safety.

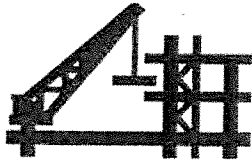
This park renovation will provide equal access and the ability to participate for all community members. We will be able to ensure that everyone, regardless of abilities, can fully participate, engage, and enjoy the benefits of the outdoors and play in a safe and supportive environment. At your request I have compiled a preliminary cost breakdown for the parking area, restroom and shelter for this project. Pricing includes all labor, materials and equipment needed to complete the work. Here is a description of the proposed work:

Parking area -

- Provide a parking area on the north edge of Nickeus Park as it borders 10th Street Northwest. The work consists of a handicap ramp with detectable warning panel at the existing sidewalk where it meets the street. An asphalt paving surface of approximately 1,920 square feet with curb and gutter on 3 sides will be added. A 6'-0" wide concrete sidewalk will run along the south side of the new parking area and will extend to the west to meet up with the existing sidewalk that runs through the park from the northwest corner to the south tip. The proposed parking area allows for two van accessible handicap parking spots and eight standard parking spots. All sitework related to the stripping of the soil, removal of trees as needed and patching into the street are included in this pricing.

The estimated cost for the parking area is _____ \$ 73,200.00

Restroom -

- Demolition of the existing restrooms is included in this pricing. The new restroom will be located in the same approximate

location. The new restroom will have concrete footings and concrete foundation walls with split faced masonry walls above grade. The building will be 10'-8" wide by 21'-4" long by 8'-0" tall and will have two handicap accessible bathrooms, a standard bathroom and a utility chase to service the bathrooms. The floors of the restroom will have sealed concrete, the walls will be painted block and the ceilings will have FRP finish. The pricing includes monies for the plumbing and electrical work as well.

A new concrete sidewalk will be added on the north side of the shelter to connect it to the restroom, as well as a sidewalk extension in the southwest corner of the shelter to tie it into the existing sidewalk that runs throughout the park. This pricing allows for lighting under the structure as well as some convenience outlets.

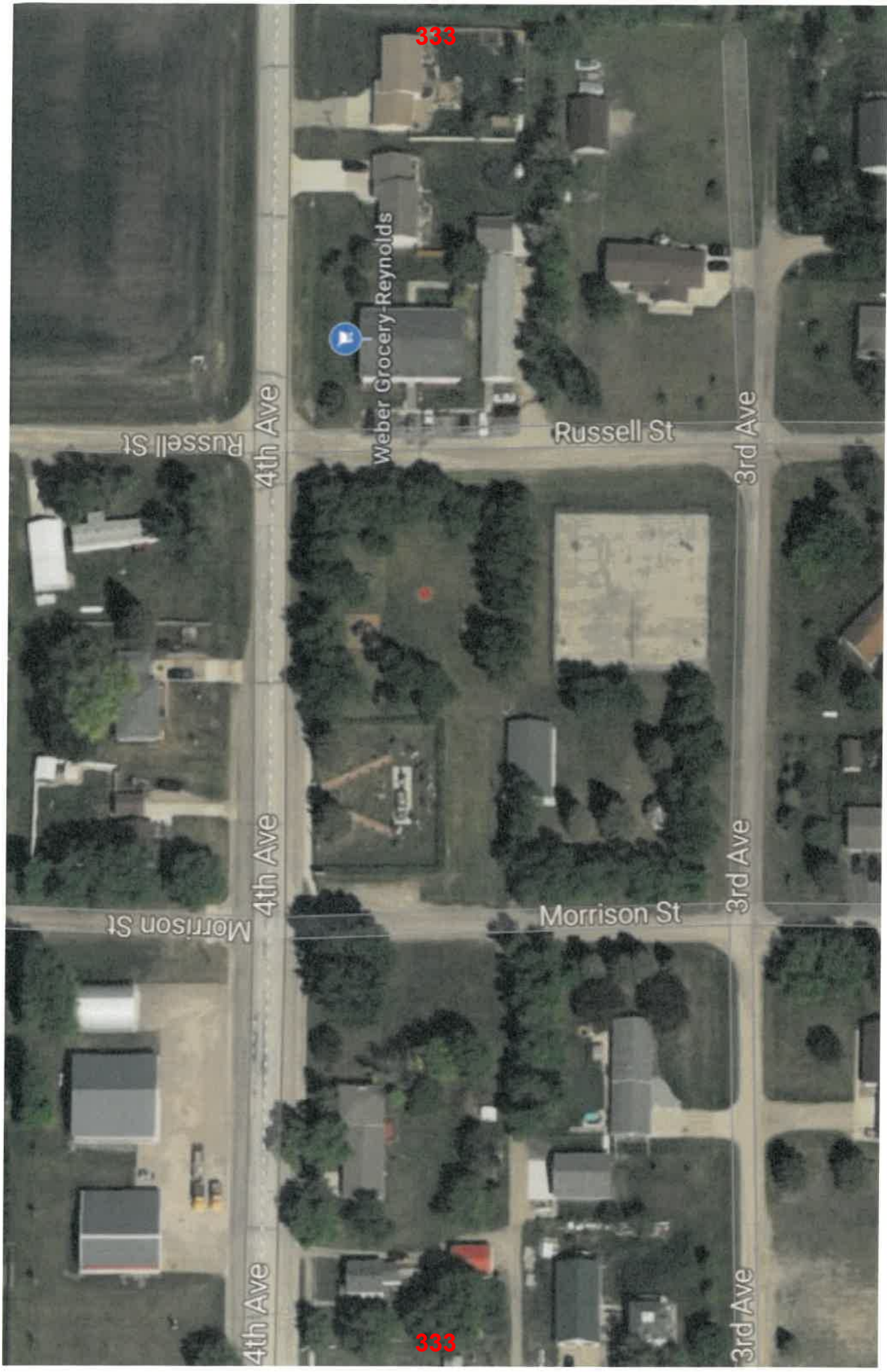


ELEVATION VIEW

The Project of this grant is to develop a park in the historic village of Manfred in Wells County. The park will include a comfort station, water hydrant, and six picnic/camping sites. The comfort station will consist of a below ground septic chamber with a wood structure built over the chamber. The wood structure will have a center wall dividing the structure into two private toileting areas. A water hydrant will be installed at the required 10 or more feet from the comfort station and six picnic/camping sites will be established nearby.

The purpose of this project is to accommodate the needs of visitors to Manfred – “an authentic settlers’ community celebrating rural America.” This Wells County village was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 2017. Manfred is situated along the south side of the James River and less than two miles south of the New Rockford Canal of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District and the North Country Trail.

Once the comfort station is in operation, it will also accommodate tour buses during their planned stops in Manfred.
