A meeting of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District's Recreation Committee was held at the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, Carrington, North Dakota, on March 20, 2024. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Kassian at 9:30 a.m.

The meeting was recorded to assist with compilation of the minutes.

READING OF THE MINUTES

Motion by Director Klein to dispense with a reading of the September 20, 2023, Recreation Committee minutes and approve them as distributed. Second by Director Metzger. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

CURRENT FUNDING AND PROJECT REVIEW

Merri Mooridian, Secretary, reviewed the list of current projects. The amount expended toward recreation projects in 2024 is \$122,684. The total for all projects approved and outstanding as of the end of February was \$2,251,611. The balance remaining to be expended on outstanding projects is \$1,874,227. A copy of the table showing current projects is attached to these minutes as Annex II.

EXPIRING PROJECTS

Ms. Mooridian reported the following recreation projects are approaching the three-year deadline to expend grant funds:

Burleigh County Commission - - Burleigh County Commission was awarded \$6,000 in April 2021 to purchase and install a picnic shelter at Steckel Landing in Wilton. To date, none of these funds have been expended. Correspondence has been sent to the county commission, but no response was received; therefore, the funds will be returned to the recreation grant program.

Oakes Parks & Recreation - - A recreation grant was awarded in the amount of \$7,520 in April 2021 to Oakes Parks & Recreation for playground equipment at West Side Park. To date, none of the funding has been expended. Correspondence has been sent to Oakes Parks & Recreation, but no reply has been received; therefore, the funds will be returned to the recreation grant program

Riverdale Park Board - - Riverdale Park Board was awarded \$1,500 in April 2021 to purchase and install a gazebo and picnic tables at Lake Side Park. To date, no funding has been expended on the project. Correspondence has been sent to the park board, but no reply has been received; therefore, the funds will be returned to the recreation grant program.

Pierce County Park Board - - The Pierce County Park Board was awarded \$3,250 in April 2021 for construction of new campsites and amenities at the Buffalo Lake Recreation Area in Esmond. To date, \$1,930.06 has been expended toward the project leaving a balance of \$1,319.94. Correspondence has been sent to the park board with no reply received; therefore, the remaining balance will be returned to the recreation grant program.

Stutsman County Park Board - - The Stutsman Park Board was awarded funding in the amount of \$3,113 in April 2021 to purchase park benches and swing sets for the Jamestown Reservoir. To date no funding has been expended on this project. Correspondence was sent to the park board with no reply received; therefore, the funds will be returned to the recreation grant program.

Williams County Parks - - Williams County Parks was awarded funding in the amount of \$17,500 in April 2021 for a vault toilet at McGregor Dam. To date, no funding has been expended on this project. Correspondence was sent to the park board with no reply received; therefore, the funds will be returned to the recreation grant program.

Abercrombie City Park Board - - The Abercrombie City Park Board was awarded \$34,682 in April 2021 for improvements at the city park, including a splash pad, playground equipment and ADA compliance for picnic tables and bathrooms. To date no funding has been expended on this project. Correspondence was sent to the park board, and a request was received for a one-year extension. This is due to a much later start date on the project than anticipated because of COVID and shipping issues, as well as contractor delays.

City of Colgate - - The City of Colgate was awarded funding of \$6,250 in April 2021 to purchase and install a picnic shelter, tables and playground equipment at the city park. To date, no funding has been expended on this project. Correspondence was sent to the city, and their reply indicated the city has not had the manpower to complete the job but have plans to complete the project this year. They are requesting a one-year extension on the project deadline.

Motion by Director Johnson to extend the project deadlines for the Abercrombie City Park Board and for the City of Colgate to July 31, 2025. Second by Director Walter. Upon voice vote, motion carried.

City of Tolna - - The City of Tolna was awarded funding of \$21,933 in October 2018 for construction of a bathhouse, RV dump site and to purchase picnic tables for the city park. An amount of \$5,522.98 was recently paid to the city for this project. To date, the committee has approved three extensions on the project deadline.

Ms. Mooridian said a letter was sent to the city in February regarding the status of the project, and a reply was received from the city auditor yesterday by email, indicating there was a delay with the plumber and the project will be finished this spring.

Stacey Gussiaas, Administrative Assistant, Garrison Diversion, stated the city has not been very receptive to her requests for information. She requested a copy of a cancelled check from the city in December that was never received at our office.

Director Walter asked what amount of funding remains to be expended.

Ms. Gussiaas answered the total funds remaining for this project is \$16,410.

Chairman Kassian asked if it is possible the city has expended additional funds.

Ms. Gussiaas said an invoice was submitted for \$6,509.72, but as she stated, a copy of the cancelled check has not been received. The city could be eligible to receive 25 percent of that amount, which would be approximately \$1,630.

Ms. Mooridian said it is up to the committee how they wish to proceed.

Motion by Director Cayko to allow the City of Tolna until April 15, 2024, to provide a copy of the cancelled check in the amount of \$6,509.72. This project will be closed out with the remaining unexpended funds returned to the recreation grant program. Second by Director Walter. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Kassian, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

Ms. Mooridian referred to the completed projects table. As of December 2023, funding in the amount of \$8.1 million has been awarded for recreation projects since the program's inception.

Expenditures for the completed projects are \$7.4 million. A copy of the table is attached to these minutes as Annex III.

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT APPLICATION

Chairman Kassian referred to the grant application form, which is included in the meeting packet. He asked if there were any questions regarding the application or changes to be made.

Ms. Mooridian said staff has no suggested changes to the application at this time.

REVIEW OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Valley City Parks & Recreation District - - Matt Brandvol and Hillary Flatt, representing Valley City Parks & Recreation District presented their request for funding in the amount of \$75,000 to replace playground equipment at the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$300,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IV.

Bottineau County Commission - - Dan Fett, representing the Bottineau County Commission and Bottineau Winter Park, presented the county commission's request for \$75,000 in grant funding to purchase and install a new snow making system for the Bottineau Winter Park. The project will be done in a couple of phases. This summer they would like to purchase ten new snow guns and replace the underground water and electrical lines. The total estimated project cost is \$971,500. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex V.

Bismarck Parks & Recreation District - - Kevin Klipfel, Executive Director, Bismarck Parks & Recreation District, presented the district's request for grant funds in the amount of \$75,000 to assist with replacement of the existing turf grass at the Municipal Ballpark with artificial turf. The total estimated project cost is \$2,542,368. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VI.

Fargo Park District - - Tony Schmitt, Park Director, Fargo Park District, presented the park board's request for \$75,000 in grant funds to install new playground equipment with a farm-themed structure at Rheault Farm. The project also includes installing permanent concrete border, three shade shelter pads and benches. The total estimated project cost is \$439,500. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VII.

Dickey County Fair Board - - Val Wagner, representing the Dickey County Fair Board, addressed the committee regarding the fair board's request for funds in the amount of \$34,996 to construct a community recreation center for year-round, multipurpose use at the fairgrounds in Ellendale. The total estimated project cost is \$139,985. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex VIII.

Grand Forks Park District - - Lief Larsen, Senior Accountant, and Steve Hell, Parks Operations Manager, Grand Forks Park District, presented the park district's request for funding assistance in the amount of \$75,000 for Grand Valley Development Park, which is a new park to be established in south Grand Forks. Plans include bike paths, a playground,

family games, a community room, landscaping features, a parking lot and sidewalks. The first phase of construction consists of a state-of-the-art playground, and the funding from Garrison Diversion would be used for playground equipment. The total estimated project cost is \$400,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex IX.

City of Grand Forks - - Kim Greendahl, Greenway Specialist, presented the city's request for \$119,695 in grant funds for the development of the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project. The proposed project includes extending the existing paved trail south of 47th Avenue South, clearing trees around the fishing site, adding benches, trash cans and a kiosk. The total estimated project cost is \$478,779. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$75,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex X.

Medina City Park - - Scott Moser and Jeremy Schmidt, representing the Medina Park Board, presented the park board's request for grant funds of \$75,000 to build a multi-use community center to be located in the city park. The total estimated project cost is \$400,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XI.

Jamestown Parks & Recreation District - - Amy Walters, Executive Director, Jamestown Parks & Recreation District, presented the park board's request for \$75,000 in grant funds to renovate the playground, picnic shelter, restroom, parking lot and pathways at Nickeus Park. The total estimated project cost is \$1,247,181. A grant has been secured from the state of North Dakota for 50% of the cost. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XII.

ND State Fair Association - - Craig Rudland and Char Ratlif, representing the ND State Fair Association, presented the State Fair's request seeking grant funds in the amount of \$75,000 to construct an ADA accessible year-round playground area in West Park at the fairgrounds. The total estimated project cost is \$232,900 A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIII.

Wells County - - Wanda Melchert, representing Wells County, presented the county's request for \$9,372 in funding to develop the park, including a comfort station, water hydrant, picnic tables and camping sites in Manfred. The total estimated project cost is \$37,488. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIV.

Williston Parks & Recreation District - - Joe Barsh, Executive Director, Williston Parks & Recreation District, presented the park board's request for recreation grant funds in the amount of \$27,688 for enhancements at its frisbee golf course at Spring Lake Park, including new restroom facilities, benches, baskets, junior holes, concrete pads, tee signs and landscaping. Total estimated project cost is \$110,751. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XV.

City of Maxbass - - The City of Maxbass requests funding assistance of \$31,141 for a basketball court, pavilion and playground equipment at Maxbass Community Park. The total estimated project cost is \$124,565. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVI.

Absaraka Parks - - Absaraka Parks is seeking \$1,250 in funding to obtain a water source to the concession stand and bathroom facility for their parks and recreation program. The total estimated project cost is \$5,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVII.

Marion Park Board - - Marion Park Board requests funding assistance in the amount of \$9,068 to construct a handicapped accessible bathroom and install an outside drinking fountain at the Marion Community Park. The total estimated project cost is \$36,723. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XVIII.

LaMoure County Commission - - The LaMoure County Commission requests \$3,500 in grant funds to install a vault toilet at Twin Lakes. The total estimated project cost is \$14,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XIX.

Anamoose Park Board - - The Anamoose Park Board is requesting \$9,071 in grant funds to install swing sets at Anamoose Park. The total estimated project cost is \$36,283. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XX.

Turtle Lake Park District - - The Turtle Lake Park District requests \$2,356 to purchase and install picnic tables at the Lake Brekken Recreation Area. The total estimated project cost is \$9,425. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXI.

McLean County Commission - - The McLean County Commission is requesting \$875 to install a new vault toilet at Sportsmens Centennial Park. The total estimated project cost is \$14,000. Funding in the amount of \$10,500 is being provided through a 75% cost share from the North Dakota Game & Fish Department. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXII.

Mohall Park District - - The Mohall Park District is seeking grant funds in the amount of \$37,500 to construct an outdoor adult recreation complex consisting of two pickleball and two bocce ball courts. The total estimated project cost is \$150,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIII.

City of Gwinner - - The City of Gwinner has requested funds in the amount of \$10,500 to develop Hero's Park. The project consists of a pergola, fence removal, picnic tables and tree planting. The total estimated project cost is \$52,730. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXIV.

City of Reynolds - - The City of Reynolds is requesting \$31,846 to construct a new gazebo with ADA accessibility and lighting. The total estimated project cost is \$63,692. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$15,923. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXV.

Surrey Park District - - The Surrey Park District is requesting \$11,125 to develop a pickleball court at Pony Tracks Park, including concrete, anchoring posts, net, painting and striping. The total estimated project cost is \$44,500. They have already purchased the net system for \$1,000, making that an ineligible component. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project

would qualify for funding in the amount of \$10,875. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXVI.

Williams Parks & Recreation District - - Williston Parks & Recreation District is requesting funding of \$75,000 to be used for Phase III of the Coyote Clay Target League Range Project, which consists of a new skeet field and additional trap houses. The total estimated project cost is \$501,628. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXVII.

Sunset Park District - - The Sunset Park District requests \$5,000 in grant funds to purchase and install playground equipment for PreK Enhancement at Grenora Sunset Park. The total estimated project cost is \$20,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex XXVIII.

CONSIDERATION OF GRANT APPLICATIONS

Ms. Mooridian reported the total amount of recreation funds available for spring and fall 2024 grant distributions is \$798,616. The total amount being requested by the 25 applicants today is \$959,115.

The committee further reviewed each of the grant applications and discussed various ways to allocate funding today and not go over the \$798,616, leaving some funds available for distribution to the fall round of applications.

Due to the amount of available funds, a suggestion was made, for this particular round of applications, to reduce all of those eligible to receive \$75,000 in funding to \$50,000 each.

The committee also discussed if the number of applications being received continues to increase in the future, along with larger project costs, whether the maximum eligible dollar amount should be decreased from \$75,000 to \$50,000.

Denied Applications

Motion by Director Walter to refer the Absaraka Parks application requesting funds for a water source to the concession stand and bathroom facility to Garrison Diversion's Water Supply Assistance Grant Program. Second by Director Metzger. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Kassian, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Director Walter to deny the funding application submitted by the City of Grand Forks for the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project as submitted, encouraging the city to reapply and clarify public access and safety measures for the project. Second by Director Cayko. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Kassian, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: none. Motion carried.

Approved Applications

Motion by Director Walter to reduce all of the projects eligible for \$75,000 in funding to \$50,000 each and approve a grand total of \$657,865 to be allocated to recreation grant program applicants as follows:

Chairman Kassian expressed concern with decreasing the funding amount to \$50,000 for the City of Medina since it is a smaller community with limited funding resources, has seldom applied for recreation grant funding and only received a small amount of funds.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Valley City for replacement of playground equipment at Valley City Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Bottineau County Commission to purchase and install a new snow making system for the Bottineau Winter Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$31,141 to the City of Maxbass for a basketball court, pavilion and playground equipment at Maxbass Community Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Bismarck Parks & Recreation District for replacement of the existing turf grass at the Municipal Ballpark with artificial turf.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to the Fargo Park District to install new playground equipment with a farm-themed structure at Rheault Farm.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$34,996 to the Dickey County Fair Board to construct a multi-purpose community recreation center for year-round use at the fairgrounds in Ellendale.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to the Grand Forks Park District to establish Grand Valley Development Park in south Grand Forks.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$9,068 to the Marion Park Board to construct a handicapped accessible bathroom and install an outside drinking fountain at the Marion Community Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$3,500 to LaMoure County to install a vault toilet at Twin Lakes.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$9,071 to the Anamoose Park Board to install swing sets at Anamoose Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$2,356 to Turtle Lake Part District to purchase and install picnic tables at the Lake Brekken Recreation Area.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$875 to McLean County Commission to install a new vault toilet at Sportsmens Centennial Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$37,500 to Mohall Park District to construct an outdoor adult recreation complex consisting of two pickleball and two bocce ball courts.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$10,500 to the City of Gwinner to develop Hero's Park, consisting of a pergola, fence removal, picnic tables and tree planting.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Medina Park Board to build a multi-use community center in the city park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Jamestown Parks & Recreation District to renovate the playground, picnic shelter, restroom, parking lot and pathways at Nickeus Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$15,923 to the City of Reynolds to construct a new gazebo with ADA accessibility and lighting.

Up to 50 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to North Dakota State Fair Association to construct an ADA accessible year-round playground area in West Park at the fairgrounds.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$10,875 to Surrey Park District for development of a pickleball court at Pony Tracks Park, including concrete, anchoring posts, painting and striping.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$9,372 to Wells County Commission to develop Manfred Park, including a comfort station, water hydrant, picnic tables and camping sites.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to Williston Parks & Recreation District to be used for Phase III of the Coyote Clay Target League Range Project, which consists of a new skeet field and additional trap houses.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$5,000 to Sunset Park District for playground equipment at Grenora Sunset Park.

Up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$27,688 to Williston Parks & Recreation District for enhancements at its frisbee golf course at Spring Lake Park, including new restroom facilities, benches, baskets, junior holes, concrete pads, tee signs and landscaping.

Second by Director Metzger. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Klein, Metzger and Walter. Those voting nay: Kassian. Motion carried.

CITY OF GRAND FORKS

Greenway Enhancement Project - - Chairman Kassian reminded the committee of its decision at the Recreation Committee meeting on March 20 to deny the funding application

submitted by the City of Grand Forks for the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project as submitted, encouraging the city to reapply and clarify public access and safety measures for the project.

Merri Mooridian, Secretary, reviewed the meeting materials provided to the committee, including correspondence between Garrison Diversion and Kim Greendahl, Greenway Specialist, regarding the denial of the City of Grand Forks' grant application. Copies of the letters are attached to these minutes as Annex I.

The city's request was for \$119,695 to develop the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project. The proposed project included extending the existing paved trail south of 47th Avenue South, clearing trees around the fishing site, adding benches, trash cans and a kiosk. The total estimated project cost is \$478,779. Under the 25 percent guidelines, the project would qualify for funding in the amount of \$75,000. A copy of the grant application is attached to these minutes as Annex II.

The committee members reviewed the application and photos of the project area followed by further discussion regarding the concerns with security.

Chairman Kassian said there is nothing in the grant application that would typically not be funded under the grant guidelines.

Director Walter expressed his continued concerns about the safety and security of the proposed site.

Director Klein stated safety and security issues are not a responsibility that falls on the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District.

Motion by Director Klein to approve funding up to 25 percent of the local, non-federal share of the eligible costs not to exceed \$50,000 to the City of Grand Forks for development of the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project. Second by Director Metzger. Upon roll call vote, the following directors voted aye: Cayko, Johnson, Kassian, Klein and Metzger. Those voting nay: Walter. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:11 a.m.

Dear members of the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Recreation Grant Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to address concerns regarding the recent grant funding application from the City of Grand Forks for the Greenway Fishing Enhancement Project.

The safety of all users is a key component and driver of this project. This will be accomplished by increasing public use of the area through connectivity and providing reliable access for law enforcement vehicles to patrol. The current ground conditions for access are grassy, sloped terrain around a stormwater pond. This access becomes muddy and slippery after spring thaw and rain, which prevents regular patrolling of the area.

Adding lighting to this area raises concerns regarding light pollution and feasibility. The closest access to electricity is approximately 650' away and would require extensive infrastructure. Seasonal flooding would require shutting the power off, and potential removal to avoid damage. Solar lights have proven unreliable in cold weather. Lighting the area would also impact the many birds known to be nesting in the surrounding woods. Pileated woodpeckers and Cooper's hawks are just two bird species nesting in this area.

Connecting to the neighborhood is crucial but will likely be established after the initial project is installed. When surveyed in 2023, many nearby residents rejected a proposal to create publicized public access near their homes due to privacy concerns. Experience, however, has shown that this sentiment will likely change when the value of an established connection between the Greenway and the neighborhood outweighs privacy concerns. Therefore, it was decided to pursue improvements to the public space that benefit all users and allow the surrounding residents to realize over time the value of connecting to their neighborhood.

Overall, it has been determined that the best solution is to open visibility to the area and provide better access from the north. This conclusion was reached when other security issues, such as security cameras and signage, failed.

Describe the Project Site As Is and Proposed Changes (Tree Removal, Drainage Filled, Etc.):

The present condition is undeveloped land bordered by an earthen levee, homes, and the Red River. A storm pond is located in the middle of the property. The area adjacent to the river is heavily forested and will require some thinning. The fishing site is an ad hoc site with no amenities. The lack of paved surfaces limits law enforcement and emergency services from accessing the site during wet weather.

The first step will be to remove some trees along the outside edge of the wooded area. This will provide more space for a paved shared-use path from the existing greenway to the fishing area. Once the trees have been cleared away, an extension will be added to the height of the existing retaining wall at the fishing site. This retaining wall is part of the storm pond outfall at the fishing site. This is meant to increase the safety of all users, as the current wall was not built to have people in the area. Finally, the trail and fishing area will be paved, and user amenities will be installed. This area is subject to periodic flooding, and pavement will make the area more accessible for maintenance and rescue staff.



Recreation Grant Program Policy Statement

MATCHING RECREATION GRANT PROGRAM

The Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Board of Directors instituted a matching recreation grant program and established that funds for the grant program will consist of two-tenths of the mill levy Garrison Diversion receives. Grants may be requested for new recreation facilities and enhancement or expansion of existing facilities.

ELIGIBILITY

Political subdivisions (park boards, water resource districts and county or city commissioners, etc.) located within the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District may apply for a matching grant. **Community groups, service clubs and non-profit organizations are not eligible to apply for funding.**

Single-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible to receive up to 25% of the non-federal share. Multiple-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible for up to 50% of the non-federal share. To be considered for a 50% non-federal cost share, more than one county must contribute substantial funds to the project.

SCOPE OF PROJECTS

Eligible projects may encompass a variety of components which provide actual, or are a complement to, natural resource outdoor recreational opportunities. Projects may include, but are not limited to: boat ramps and docks; picnic facilities; restrooms; campgrounds; bathhouses; playground areas; and bicycle, pedestrian, or horse trails.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Recreation Committee meets biannually to consider grant applications. Application and required documentation must be postmarked or received electronically by March 1 or September 1 to be considered at the next meeting.

The application must include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Audience intended to be served
- 2. Breakdown of estimated costs, including future operations and maintenance
- 3. Predicted source of all funding
- 4. Plans for new construction

GUIDELINES FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- Applications must include a list of all funding sources applied for and amounts received.
- All projects must have long-term managing partners with operation and maintenance funds available for the life of the project.
- Applicants requesting \$25,000 or more are encouraged to attend the Recreation Committee meeting to present the project and answer questions from the committee.

ELIGIBLE PROJECT COSTS

Site planning costs, including engineering costs, may be included as eligible project costs. Individual projects are eligible to receive up to a maximum of \$75,000 award.

Only costs incurred after the date of grant approval by Garrison Diversion will be eligible for reimbursement.

Money to be credited as the local sponsor's share of the project may be raised in a number of ways and may consist of actual dollars or in-kind donations of labor, materials and equipment costs.

NON-ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Types of projects or elements of projects that are not qualified to receive funding:

- 1. Maintenance of an existing facility/structure, i.e. painting/staining, re-reroofing, etc.
- 2. Any type of facility used for maintenance equipment or the purchase of maintenance equipment
- 3. Development, enhancement or maintenance of roads to or within facilities
- 4. Water lines, sewer lines and electrical services to facilities other than immediate hookups.
- 5. Projects on private property without a public interest to the land
- 6. Projects on school property
- 7. Shore stabilization including riprap
- 8. Any project that does not meet current ADA standards
- 9. Land acquisition costs will not be considered eligible for reimbursement; the land valuation may not be credited toward the local sponsor's match.
- 10. Projects that do not allow reasonable access by the public
- 11. Golf courses, hockey arenas, monument type veteran/public servant memorials, or art/theatre projects

If your submitted application includes any of the non-qualified components listed above, the application will be returned for resubmission before the corresponding deadline.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPROVED GRANTS

Following completion of the project and verification of expenditures, reimbursement will be made by Garrison Diversion. Partial payment requests may be made at the discretion of the project sponsor. Projects receiving grants over \$5,000 will be provided a sign, paid for by the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, naming major sponsors of the project.

Approved recreation projects have three years to be completed. If the project has not been completed within that time frame, the sponsoring agency will need to report to the Recreation Committee in order to retain any unused funds, or the unused funds will be returned to Garrison Diversion's recreation grant pool.

Argusville Park Site Assessment 2022

Conducted by the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund

The current play structure at Argusville Park is over 28 years old and clearly shows its age. It is a residential-grade unit not intended for public use, nor does it meet current safety standards.






Several safety hazards were identified during the assessment:

Entrapment Areas: Multiple entrapment areas were found on the complex, where a child's body could fit through, but not their head, posing a significant risk of injury.

Sharp Edges and Exposed Materials: The slide has sharp edges from broken plastic, and there are exposed concrete and timbers, all of which are hazards that could cause injury.





Improper Placement of Swings: The swings are located next to power poles, not meeting the required clear space around them for safe landing zones.

Argusville Park Going Forward

Proposed Area to be updated:

The proposed updates will focus on the area designated for the 5-12 year-old play structures. This will include a main commercial-grade unit along with freestanding structures for swings, climbing, and spinning activities. Additionally, the space will be expanded to incorporate play structures for 2-5 year-old children, including a main play unit, a freestanding spinner, a swing, and a climbing apparatus designed for younger kids.



Updated Park Structures to be installed:

Below is an example of the potential equipment to be installed. Final details, such as colors and the selection of freestanding equipment, have not yet been finalized.

The proposed equipment includes:

- Main Play Units: Commercial-grade structures designed to meet current safety standards and cater to different age groups.
- **Freestanding Structures**: Swings, climbing structures, and spinning apparatuses suitable for both older and younger children.

By addressing these critical safety issues and updating the play equipment, Argusville Park aims to create a safe, inclusive, and engaging environment for all children in the community.







Description of Project Features

As part of the Grand Forks Park District's operational planning, older playgrounds that have reached the end of their useful life will be replaced by new facilities. The current playground equipment at Riverside Park was erected in 1996 and the Park District has determined that replacing it in 2025 will be a priority.

Riverside Park is approximately 25 acres on the north side of Grand Forks and nestled beautifully against the Red River on the border of Minnesota. Maps of the park have been included in this application. The park was purchased in 1909 and was one of the first park developments in the city of Grand Forks. Amenities at the park include a pool and bath house, an ice-skating rink and warming house, tennis courts, playground, shelters and more. There are half a dozen landscape beds throughout the park and the Greenway Bike Path moves through the park, weaving peacefully along the Red River.

A unique and popular park, its location is nearly entirely located within the floodplain, thus levees and flood protection systems are located along the inner perimeter of the park. The flood of 1997 required redesign of the park and pool to accommodate the flood protection system. The new system placed the park on the unprotected side of the levee. Periodic flooding is an accepted occurrence and appropriate steps are made to minimize damage to amenities in case of spring overflow of the Red River.

A detailed proposal and specifications of the playground equipment from Grondahl Recreation, Inc. is included with this grant application. Although the price on the proposal is listed at about \$170,000.00 it is expected that the delivered price will be approximately \$150,000.00. Description of Project Features:

The Watford City Park District is excited to embark on the journey to provide our community with an inclusive playground that embraces accommodations for all to enjoy. The inclusive playground will be designed with equipment and resources that meet the needs of individuals with a diverse range of disabilities and abilities alike. The playground will not just offer disability essentials such as ramps and railings but will include equipment that blends physical activities with accessibility, sensory, and nature to make everyone feel healthy and happy in the playground. The environment will provide a multisensory experience including features that incorporate sound, textures, and colors, to improve motor skills, stimulate creativity, and boost physical and social development.

Accessibility will also be key to creating engagement opportunities for adults and individuals with wheelchairs and strollers. Accommodation will include poured-in-place rubber surface that will be both efficient for accessibility and stimulating for play and imagination. Large walkways will allow for connectivity to upper-level equipment thus enhancing undisrupted playful interaction between adults, children, and their peers.

The project of building an inclusive playground is important to our community as it will create an environment that offers diverse recreational opportunities while promoting community cohesion and love of recreation while meeting the needs of our community. The Watford City Park District aims to develop a culture in which it provides recreational programs and services that are accessible and adaptive to the community's physical, mental, social, and psychological needs.

The inclusive playground will positively impact the residents and visitors of Watford City, McKenzie County, and surrounding communities. Currently the closest inclusive playground is located approximately eighty miles away. This distance creates hardship upon those that would benefit most from access to an inclusive playground.

Estimated Number of People Served:

Currently the estimated number of people that will be directly impacted is 1,400. This includes approximately five hundred children living within walking distance, a nearby elementary school, a daycare which serves two hundred children ranging from birth to five years old, and an after-school program that serves children ranging from kindergarten through fifth grade. In addition, approximately forty disabled children living within the community are not able to utilize traditional playgrounds. The inclusive playground will offer direct services to these children by providing them with undisrupted play with peers and caregivers. Finally, the project will reach out to serve individuals within McKenzie

County and surrounding counties as it will be the only one of its kind within an eighty-mile distance.

The project will also create a positive collaboration of partners between community donors, volunteers, the City of Watford City, and the Watford City Park District to ensure the life of the project for many generations to enjoy.

Describe the Project Site as is and Proposed Changes:

The project site is in a green space with surrounding paved paths, pavilions, a softball field, and fishing pond. The site is currently lacking a play space that stimulates an imaginative, safe, and engaging environment. The location will need to have landscaping, seeding, and irrigation. Poured-in-place rubber will be added as the playground surface and multisensory inclusive play equipment will be installed to suit the needs of individuals of all abilities. The current gravel parking lot will be improved by the City of Watford City to add eight concrete ADA accessible parking stalls.






Kent Pelton Playground Schematic Design






The Steele County Park Board is a local political subdivision in Steele County, ND and primarily has jurisdiction over Golden Lake. Golden Lake is a recreational lake located in the middle of Steele County, ND, approximately 75 miles SW from Grand Forks, ND and NW from Fargo, ND. The Steele County Park Board has made a number of changes to Golden Lake throughout the years to include: increased inlet/outlet system to allow the Lake to receive more or less water pending the local conditions, rebuilt the inlet system so that it is in proper working condition, and has recently, with the help of a FEMA HMGP grant, placed rated storm shelters on both sides of the Lake to help protect the visitors from the weather and other natural hazards. The Steele County Park Board is committed to enhancing Golden Lake to be a major spot for all visitors to relax, enjoy the outdoors, and have a little fun.

PROJECT PROPOSAL:

The project proposed is to build a pickleball and basketball court for the visitors of Golden Lake. Pickleball has hit the United States with a fierce passion as of the last several years. It is truly a sport for everyone ages 0-99+. The Park Board owns an enclosed, heated, and airconditioned Pavilion on the west side of the lake where events take place such as birthday parties, graduation parties, and family reunions. Behind the Pavilion is an empty lot where a pickleball court could be placed.

The idea is a simple one – install a pickleball court with an addition for a basketball court and/or volleyball court. These items meet the requirements for the Park Board to help improve the experiences of the lake as well as get people to get out into the open air and experience the great outdoors.

The project, due to funding constraints, will have to be completed in phases. Phase 1 is the installation of the concrete slab. A quote showing \$76,000 for the slab is attached. Phase 2 includes the fencing of the courts themselves. A quote for \$45,445 for the fencing is attached. Phase 3 is the final phase of this project and includes the installation of the courts which include the netting, striping, hoops, and everything else involved with the project. A quote for \$81,970 is included for Phase 3 of this project.

THE REQUEST:

Phase 1 is currently being requested for help in funding. Phase 1 is the concrete work for the project. The Park Board recognizes that a project isn't complete without help from the local people that are supporting the project. To date, the Park Board has \$20,000 in local

donations with the promise of in-kind help during each phase of the project. Additional grant/funding requests are being pursued; however, have proven unsuccessful at this point. The idea is to complete this project in phases, with help from grant requests such as this one, as well as other local funding requests, and in-kind donations. This project is considered priority 1 for the Park Board and most of the funding received by the Park Board is going to support this project. Annual maintenance costs on this project total close to \$3,000 once completed and those costs will be bore by the Park Board.

CONCLUSION:

The Steele County Park Board requests \$75,000 to help begin the phases of the project. Phase 1 will be to get the cement poured for the courts. Phase 2 includes the fencing around the courts. Phase 3 includes the finality of the project which is the installation of the courts, painting the lines, and any additional project costs.

Hope Park Board - Garrison Diversion Grant Project Proposal

BACKGROUND:

The City of Hope Park Board is a local political subdivision of the City of Hope, located in Steele County, ND. The Hope Park Board has primary jurisdiction over the parks in the City of Hope with additional jurisdiction of the Hope Golf Course. The Hope Golf Course is located approximately 3 miles east of the City of Hope along the junction of ND Hwy 32 and ND Hwy 38. The Hope Park Board has made several changes throughout the years to the Hope Golf Course to include grass greens instead of sand greens, building and installation of golf cart shacks, installed irrigation to the grass greens, and repairs to the clubhouse. The Hope Park Board is committed to enhancing the Golf Course and the parks in the City to be a major spot for all visitors to play, relax, and have fun.

PROJECT PROPOSAL:

The project proposed is to build a new clubhouse located at the golf course. The old clubhouse (currently standing) was built in the 1960s and is no longer functional. The Park Board has spent over \$500,000 in the last 10 years alone on the maintenance and upkeep of the clubhouse. This clubhouse has served its purpose and is no longer functional for the needs of the Park Board. The Park Board is wanting to build a new clubhouse which will also accommodate a large meeting space to be rented out for local and area meetings. This project is part of a larger plan within the City of Hope to expand the meeting spaces that are available at any given time. Currently, the only meeting space available is the American Legion located in the City of Hope. This only sits about 100 people and cannot hold the people involved in the different meetings/associations/gatherings throughout the year. Small communities like the City of Hope boast a robust agricultural community. The Clifford Elevator is a large part of the agricultural community in the City of Hope and throughout the 200-mile radius from the City of Hope. This employer alone hosts an annual meeting for its producers and employees and CANNOT rent out the Legion due to the sheer size of the people coming to the meeting. A new space would allow for employers like the Elevator to host their meetings in the community in which they serve, all while keeping funding and economic impacts within the local community in which it serves.

The current clubhouse, due to the changing weather conditions over the years, has flooded due to overland and river floodings in 8 of the last 10 years of floods. Two years ago, the clubhouse was completely gutted and cleaned due to the flood waters. Last year, the roof caved in due to the exorbitant amount of snow and ice received and ruined the cleaning that was completed only the year before. In order to get the clubhouse ready for this year,

the Park Board had to spend another \$150,000 to gut, clean, and repair the clubhouse to get everything back in working order.

Due to all these repairs, the clubhouse has seen some major electrical problems. Animals and critters seek shelter in the crevasses of the building and have ruined the electrical lines in the building. This problem caused the clubhouse to not be open this year for the season and has required the Park Board to get creative in how they opened the golf course for the season. Unfortunately, this has caused the Park Board to make the decision to build a new building instead of investing any more money into the current building. This decision did not come easy; however, a funding campaign was started to get a new building and just over \$400,000 has been raised by the community in a short 4-month period.

The idea is to build a new 48x80 building with a commercial kitchen and a large meeting area to accommodate the needs of the city, the Park Board, the golf course, and the needs of the supporters of the City and the Park Board.

THE REQUEST:

The request is for \$75,000 in funding to help the Park Board come closer to its goal of building a new clubhouse. To date, the Park Board has raised over \$400,000 in private donations specifically earmarked for this project. The Park Board is planning on beginning this project this fall still with the removal of the old building and the digging of the foundation work. This request will go to help with this process. Additional funds are being requested through other funding sources such as USDA, National Parks Service, and other local and state agencies. Annual maintenance costs for this project will be up to \$25,000 and will be bore by the Hope Park Board. These maintenance costs will also save the taxpayers in the Hope Park District thousands of dollars over the years as the Park Board will be able to levy less dollars to maintain its parks.

Jamestown Parks and Recreation Field Renovation- Phase II Tee Ball Fields

August 15, 2024

Description of Project Features:

Since 2015 the local youth baseball organization, Jaybal, has identified the need to renovate the Al Boelke Youth baseball complex. Limitations of funding and other community priorities has delayed the project moving forward. Despite the lack of appropriate playing facilities youth baseball is thriving in Jamestown and currently there are 22 teams with approximately 360 players. The complex currently consists of 4 little league fields in the northeast portion of McElroy Park adjacent to Jack Brown Stadium. It serves as the primary location for youth (ages 6-12) baseball competitions and as a practice facility for Babe Ruth, Legion, High School, College, and Amateur teams. No significant updates or renovations have been made to the complex since it was originally constructed in the 1960s. The complex currently does not meet player or fan safety expectations, accessibility requirements, or include the amenities that are expected at youth athletic facilities. This has resulted in opposing teams refusing to travel to Jamestown for competitions and the inability to host tournaments. In 2023 Mammoth Sports Construction was contracted by Jamestown Parks and Recreation to begin Phase I of the field renovation project. Phase I consists of a Babe Ruth baseball field, a Cal Ripken baseball/fastpitch softball field, batting cages, and support building to include restrooms, concessions and maintenance. The first phase is scheduled for completion by December 2024. This request is to fund the top priority in Phase II which is two multipurpose tee ball sized fields that will also be ADA accessible and used for Special Olympics and other groups that offer programming for individuals with disabilities.

Justification of Project

Number of people served:

Currently the facility serves the following constituents as detailed below. After the renovation we anticipate these numbers to increase significantly due to the ability to host additional youth tournaments.

- 300 local players (families) age 5-18 registered in Jaybal programs
- 80 middle school and high school players (some duplication with the above)
- 80 University of Jamestown players
- 36 Amateur Mens players
- Jack Brown Stadium host to 13 teams, Youth complex home to youth city league and 4 competitive teams
- 50,000 visits to Jack Brown Stadium and Youth baseball complex throughout the season April-September
- 10,000 anticipated to be from outreach communities, 5,000 from larger communities (Fargo, Bismarck, etc...), and 35,000 local visits
- Host to several state and regional tournaments to include the NDHSAA Class A and B baseball
 and fast pitch softball yearly. Host all State Amateur tournaments for 3 divisions.

Describe Project Site As Is and Proposed Changes:

Previously the site consisted of 4 little league fields in the northeast portion of McElroy Park. Phase I will reconfigure and add fields and amenities that require the demolition and relocation of the Jamestown Parks and Recreation maintenance shop. Additionally, a restroom, small misc storage buildings and a tennis court that currently serves as a skate park will be vacated and the space repurposed. Extensive excavation and underground drainage work will occur at the site in addition to the construction of a multi-purpose building to serve as restrooms, concessions and a community gathering space. Additional components will include off street parking, paved connecting pathways, shaded and sheltered bleachers, and landscaping with the planting of trees. The second phase in the master design of the complex prioritizes two tee-ball sized fields that will be fully surfaced with artificial turf. The artificial turf will provide an accessible and safe playing surface for individuals with disabilities as well as our youngest community members to play tee ball. Jamestown Parks and Recreation will work with local providers of adaptive programming such as Special Olympics and Anne Carlsen Center to offer this space to play! Currently there are no dedicated playing fields for tee ball or adaptive programming in Jamestown.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board - August 20, 2024

At 10:24 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Levi Taylor, Mark Klose, Joan Morris were present. Merri Mooridian and Henry Steinberger were present via phone.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, presented an update on the playground equipment at Lakeside Park. Bergh stated that the playground equipment has reached its life expectancy and is no longer usable. Bergh would like to submit a grant request from Garrison Diversion. Morris stated her hesitancy due to the area of playground equipment being installed being a shared property with the Farmer's Union camp. Farmer's Union asked that they consider helping with the cost of the equipment. Wolsky suggested putting an agreement into place between Farmer's Union and Stutsman County giving the county final say over the equipment on the shared land. Bergquist stated that this year could focus on the removal of the outdated equipment and then replacing the equipment in the spring. Taylor suggested having the Park Portfolio have a grant proposal prepared and meet with Farmers Union and present it to the Commission.

Bergquist brought forth an article that was released by the Jamestown Sun about the ground squirrel infiltration west of Ave Maria and questioned whether the Park Board or Bureau of Reclamation currently owned the land. Bergh stated that the Park Board manages the land, but the Bureau retained the property. Mooridian suggested looking into the contracting with the USDA about the infestation.

Morris asked Mike May, Interstate Engineering, about the island bridge. May stated that the project was moved by the DOT to 2026 due to funding sources. Morris stated that this project is being partially funded through the ARPA fund and that the funds need to be spent by the end of 2026. Alonge clarified that the grant for the box culvert was through the DOT and the bid date was moved to 2025, but due to the ARPA funds, the county needs a signed contract and bid date before the end of 2024.

Mooridian stated that Bergh would not be able to order any playground equipment if he was seeking a Garrison Diversion grant for the project. The grant due dates are September 1, 2024, or April 1, 2025. A motion for Bergh to apply for the Garrison Diversion Grant by September 1 was made by Berquist, seconded by Steinberger. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the mid-month bills was made by Mooridian, seconded by Taylor. Roll call vote: Morris, Taylor, Klose, Mooridian, Steinberger, Bergquist, and Wolsky voted aye. Motion carried.




